## SENATE BILL No. 58

AN ACT amending the Kansas uniform trust code; relating to trust property; amending K.S.A. 58a-810 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 58a-810 is hereby amended to read as follows: 58a-810. (a) A trustee shall keep adequate records of the administration of the trust.

(b) A trustee shall keep trust property separate from the trustee's own property.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d), a trustee shall cause the trust property to be designated so that the interest of the trust, to the extent feasible, appears in records maintained by a party other than a trustee or beneficiary.

 $(d) \;\;$  If the trustee maintains records clearly indicating the respective interests, a trustee may invest as a whole the property of two or more separate trusts.

(e) Any property may be acquired in the name of the trust or in the name of the trustee. Property titled in the trust name may be conveyed only in the trust name or in the name of the trustee of that trust, provided that the trust name is clearly set forth in the conveyance.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 58a-810 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
