## Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1601

| 9  | A PROPOSITION to amend section 6 of article 6 of the constitution of        |
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| 10 | the state of Kansas, relating to school finance.                            |
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| 12 | Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Kansas, two-thirds of the |
| 13 | members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate and two-         |
| 14 | thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House     |
| 15 | of Representatives concurring therein:                                      |
| 16 | Section 1. The following proposition to amend the constitution of the       |
| 17 | state of Kansas shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the state   |
| 18 | for their approval or rejection: Section 6 of article 6 of the constitution |
| 19 | of the state of Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:                |
| 20 | <b>"§ 6. Finance.</b> (a) The legislature may levy a permanent tax          |
| 21 | for the use and benefit of state institutions of higher education and       |
| 22 | apportion among and appropriate the same to the several institu-            |
| 23 | tions, which levy, apportionment and appropriation shall continue           |
| 24 | until changed by statute. Further appropriation and other provision         |
| 25 | for finance of institutions of higher education may be made by the          |
| 26 | legislature.  |
| 27 | (b) The legislature shall make suitable provision <i>provide</i> for fi-    |
| 28 | nance of the educational interests of the state in the manner and           |
| 29 | amount as determined solely by the legislature. No tuition shall be         |
| 30 | charged for attendance at any public school to pupils required by           |
| 31 | law to attend such school, except such fees or supplemental charges         |
| 32 | as may be authorized by law. The legislature may authorize the state        |
| 33 | board of regents to establish tuition, fees and charges at institutions     |
| 34 | under its supervision.  |
| 35 | (c) No religious sect or sects shall control any part of the public         |
| 36 | educational funds."   |
| 37 | Sec. 2. The following statement shall be printed on the ballot with         |
| 38 | the amendment as a whole:   |
| 39 | <i>"Explanatory statement.</i> The purpose of this amendment is to pro-     |
| 40 | vide that the financing of educational interests of the state shall         |
| 41 | be in the manner and amount determined solely by the                        |
| 42 | legislature.  |
| 43 | "A vote for this amendment would provide that the financing of the          |

educational interests of the state would be solely determined by 1 2 your representatives and senators in the Kansas legislature. 3 "A vote against this amendment would continue in effect the current interpretation by the Kansas Supreme court that this pro-4  $\mathbf{5}$ vision of the Kansas constitution requires the Kansas legislature to make suitable provision for the finance of the educational 6 7 system of the state in an amount determined by the court." Sec. 3. This resolution, if approved by two-thirds of the members 8 9 elected (or appointed) and qualified to the Senate, and two-thirds of the members elected (or appointed) and qualified to the House of Repre-10 sentatives shall be entered on the journals, together with the yeas and 11 nays. The secretary of state shall cause this resolution to be published as 1213 provided by law and shall cause the proposed amendment to be submitted to the electors of the state at the general election in November in the 1415year 2008 unless a special election is called at a sooner date by concurrent 16 resolution of the legislature, in which case it shall be submitted to the electors of the state at the special election. 17
