9 A RESOLUTION memorializing the Congress of the United States to
10 balance the federal budget by 2012.

12 WHEREAS, The expenditures of the federal government affect the 13 welfare of all citizens and to some degree the citizens of all nations. As 14 the world's only superpower our government's actions and the results 15 thereof are vital to the world's well being. Needless to say leadership costs 16 money, and our government has not been found wanting in its expendi-17 tures of money; and

18WHEREAS, The sobering truth though is that throughout the past 19several years the federal government has spent more than it has received, 20and borrowed enormous sums from foreign powers such as Saudi Arabia 21and China. From a federal debt of \$1 trillion in 1980, the public debt has 22 increased to \$8 billion in 2005, and we have been experiencing annual 23 budget deficits exceeding \$500 billion. The cumulative effect of repeated 24 deficit spending weakens our currency in the world marketplace, damages 25our national competitiveness in global competition, and results in the 26 continued erosion of the value of our citizens' savings and their ability to 27 maintain or improve their standard of living; and 28WHEREAS, There comes a time when even our nation must be fis-29 cally responsible: Now, therefore, 30

30 *Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas:* The we memo-31 rialize the Congress of the United States to accept its fiscal responsibility 32 to its citizens and produce a balanced budget by the year 2012; and

33 *Be it further resolved:* That the Secretary of the Senate provide an 34 enrolled copy of this resolution to the President of the United States 35 Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and
