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9 AN ACT establishing the broadband technology and application advisory 10council; relating to membership, compensation and powers and duties thereof. 11 1213 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 14Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the broadband technology 15and application advisory council. The advisory council shall be composed 16 of both technology providers and users with a knowledge of emerging 17technologies and such technologies innovative application to addressing human improvement opportunities and the delivery of government serv-1819ices. The advisory council shall have 15 members, including two ex officio 20members who shall be the director of the Kansas university telemedicine 21program and the director of information and telecommunications tech-22 nology center and who shall serve as co-chairpersons of the advisory coun-23 cil. The remaining 13 members shall be appointed as follows: 24 Three members shall be appointed by the speaker of the house (1)25of representatives and of such members, each shall be from the telecom-26 munications industry and shall represent a different technological broad-27 band delivery system; 28(2)three members shall be appointed by the president of the senate; 29 of such members, one member shall be appointed from the education sector, one member shall be appointed from the health care sector and 30 31one member shall be appointed from the business sector and each of 32 such members shall utilize broadband technologies in delivering services; 33 (3)two members shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 34 house of representatives; of such members, one member shall be ap-35 pointed from the library sector and one from the agriculture sector and 36 all such members shall be knowledgeable regarding broadband technol-37 ogy applications; 38 (4) two members shall be appointed by the minority leader of the 39 senate; of such members, one member shall be appointed from the social 40 service sector and one from the general public sector and each of such 41members shall be knowledgeable regarding broadband technology appli-42cations: and 43 (5)three members shall be appointed by the governor; of such mem-

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1 bers, two members shall be appointed from the state government and

2 one member shall be appointed from a regents institution and each of
3 such members shall be knowledgeable regarding broadband technologies
4 and applications.

5 (b) Advisory council members, other than for the co-chairpersons 6 who are ex officio members, shall have a term of office of four years and 7 any such member may be reappointed. Any vacancy occurring in the 8 membership of the advisory council shall be filled in the same manner as 9 the original appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term of the 10 member creating the vacancy.

(c) The staff of the office of the revisor of statutes, the legislative
research department, state government agencies and regents' institutions
shall provide such assistance as may be requested by the co-chairpersons
of the advisory council.

15 (d) The advisory council shall review:

(1) Available broadband service delivery applications in the fields of
education, commerce, health care and other sectors affecting the state's
public interest and regarding access to government;

(2) emerging technologies that public policymakers and state and local government agencies should consider prior to investing further in
existing technologies and service delivery systems;

(3) interfacing technologies and user applications to make the serv ices easier to use, more affordable and available to all relevant
 constituencies;

(4) technological opportunities that are likely to arise five or more
years in the future and policies necessary for government agencies and
the general public to avail themselves of the benefits of technological
change; and

(5) such other matters as members of the advisory council identify.

(e) On the first day of the regular session of the legislature and annually thereafter the advisory council shall submit to the house committee
on government efficiency and technology, house committee on energy
and utilities and senate committee on commerce, or the successor committees thereof, and the governor, a report on the information and policy
recommendations of the council regarding:

(1) The subjects reviewed pursuant to subsection (d); and

(f) Except as provided by this subsection, nonstate employees of the advisory council attending meetings of the advisory council shall be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.
