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9 AN ACT concerning sustainability of certain reservoirs; imposing certain 10 fees and surcharges.

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42 43 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

- Section 1. (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the Kansas reservoir sustainability fund. On and after July 1, 2008, there is hereby imposed a reservoir sustainability fee at the rate of:
- \$.05 per 1,000 gallons of water sold at retail by a public water supply system and delivered through mains, lines or pipes;
- (2) subject to the provisions of subsection (c), \$.05 per 1,000 gallons of water appropriated for industrial use pursuant to a permit, including water sold to water assurance districts;
- a \$5 surcharge for annual boat licensing; a \$2 surcharge on annual state park permits; a \$.50 surcharge on daily state park permits; and a surcharge of \$.20 per \$1,000 surcharge for insurance coverage against flood damage; and
- \$12 per acre foot of water used by a holder of water rights in water in a reservoir managed by the United States army corp of engineers or the United States bureau of reclamation or by a holder of water rights in water downstream from such reservoir.
- As used in this section, "industrial use" has the meaning provided by rules and regulations of the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the Kansas department of agriculture and the determination of gallons used shall be based upon figures supplied to the secretary of revenue by the division of water resources.
- (c) The fees imposed by subsections (a)(2) shall be based on the actual amount used for industrial use during the preceding calendar year as reported to the chief engineer of the division of water resources of the Kansas department of agriculture in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 82a-732, and amendments thereto.
- (d) The fee imposed by subsection (a)(1) shall be paid quarterly by the public water supplier and shall be transmitted to the department of revenue not later than 45 days following the end of each quarter. The public water supplier may collect the fee directly from each consumer to which water is sold at retail or may pay the amount owed to the depart-

ment from moneys in its operating or other fund available for that purpose. The fees imposed by subsection (a)(2) shall be paid quarterly by the owner of the permit and shall be transmitted to the department of revenue not later than 45 days following the end of each quarter. If any retailer or permit owner fails to pay the fee required to be collected and paid under this section, there shall be added, to the unpaid balance of the fee, penalty and interest as prescribed under K.S.A. 79-3615, and amendments thereto, for the late payment of sales tax. The fees imposed by subsection (a)(3) shall be paid to the department of wildlife and parks at the time the boating license or park permit is issued. The insurance coverage surcharge should be paid through the insurer at the time of collection of premiums.

- (e) The director of taxation shall administer, enforce and collect the fees imposed by subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2) of this section. All laws and rules and regulations of the secretary relating to the administration, enforcement and collection of the retailers' sales tax shall apply to such fee insofar as they can be made applicable, and the secretary shall adopt such additional rules and regulations as necessary for the efficient and effective administration, enforcement and collection thereof.
- (f) There shall be a three year moratorium on increasing such fees. After the expiration of the three year moratorium, the director of the Kansas water office may change the fee payments based on projected costs of upcoming approved projects. The director may only increase the state park permit surcharge and boating license surcharge after consultation with the Kansas department of wildlife and parks, with such increases subject to any necessary legislative approval. The director may only increase the flood damage insurance coverage surcharge after consultation with the Kansas insurance department, with such increases subject to any necessary legislative approval.
- (g) The director of taxation, the department of wildlife and parks and insurers shall remit all moneys collected from fees imposed pursuant to this section to the state treasurer in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 75-4215, and amendments thereto. Upon receipt of each such remittance, the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount in the state treasury to the credit of the state water plan fund created by K.S.A. 82a-951, and amendments thereto. The director of the Kansas water office shall expend funds subject to the recommendations and approval of the Kansas water authority, with such expenditures subject to any necessary legislative approval.
- (h) Moneys credited to the Kansas reservoir sustainability fund shall be used for the following purposes:
- (1) To establish a program to eliminate releases of water from Kansas reservoirs by the United States army corp of engineers;

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- to monitor water storage capacity and water quality in state 2 reservoirs;
 - to ensure the sustainability of each reservoir's operational capacity by controlling and managing sediment deposits that adversely affect water storage capacity, drinking water quality and recreational opportunities. Each reservoir's operational capacity shall be measured by sustainability levels deemed scientifically and fiscally responsible by the Kansas water office and the Kansas water authority; and
 - to encourage participation in upstream conservation and water management programs developed by the Kansas state conservation commission.
 - Other duties of the director of the Kansas water office regarding the management of the Kansas reservoir sustainability fund shall include:
 - The submission of an annual report regarding the suitability of drinking water supplies in reservoirs controlled or managed by the United States army corp of engineers and the United States bureau of reclamation. Such report shall be made to the Kansas water authority, the governor and the legislature before the end of each fiscal year; and
 - (2) the submission of an annual report assessing the impact that the state's reservoirs have on ground water supplies. The director shall collaborate with the Kansas geological survey, Kansas biological survey, United States army corp of engineers, United States bureau of reclamation and United States geological survey. Such report shall be made to the governor and the legislature before the end of each fiscal year.
 - All expenditures from the Kansas reservoir sustainability fund shall be made in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the director of the Kansas water office or by a person designated by the director.
