 $9\,$ $\,$ AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers; enacting the law enforcement family support act.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) This act may be cited as the law enforcement officer family support act.

- (b) As used in this act:
- (1) "Administering agency" means the Kansas commission on peace officers' standards and training created by K.S.A. 74-5606, and amendments thereto.
- (2) "Duty-related cause" means any of the following which happens to a law enforcement officer while acting in the line of duty: Injury caused by the criminal act of another, injury from a motor vehicle or other accident, contracting of a contagious disease or injury caused by exposure to a hazardous material. "Duty-related cause" does not include any injury to a law enforcement officer while such officer is engaged in a criminal act, intoxicated, performing law enforcement actions in a grossly negligent manner or acting to intentionally cause harm to the officer's self.
- (3) "Immediate family" means the law enforcement officer's spouse, any child of the officer who was living in the officer's home at the time of the officer's injury or death and any child of the officer for whom the officer was providing health insurance coverage or child support at the time of the officer's death or injury.
- (4) "In the line of duty" means: (A) While the law enforcement officer is on duty with a law enforcement agency; or (B) while the law enforcement officer is off duty and is engaged in the investigation of criminal activity, aiding a person suffering from or in danger of physical injury or performing a law enforcement action, traffic control action or rescue action.
- (5) "Law enforcement officer" has the meaning provided by K.S.A. 74-5602, and amendments thereto.
- (6) "On duty" means: (A) For an officer who is paid on an hourly basis, during the period between the times when the officer begins and ends an assignment by the law enforcement agency and for which the officer is being paid; and (B) for a salaried officer, during the period

between the times when the officer begins and ends the officer's normal working hours or at other times while the officer is actually engaged in work performed directly for the law enforcement agency.

- (7) "Permanent and total disability" means a disability: (A) Which renders a law enforcement officer unable to work as such an officer or at any other employment; and (B) from which such officer is unlikely to recover, as determined as follows: An assessment and determination shall be made by a physician selected by the officer, or by the officer's closest relative if the officer is mentally incapacitated, and by a second physician selected by the administering agency. If the two physicians do not agree on the determination of disability, the opinion of a third physician selected by the administering agency shall be obtained.
- (c) Subject to appropriations, the following benefits shall be provided in the case of the death of a law enforcement officer from a duty-related cause:
- (1) A \$100,000 cash payment to the officer's immediate family, if any, within 45 days after the officer's death;
- (2) health insurance coverage for the officer's immediate family under the state employees' group health insurance plan, at no cost to the family, which coverage shall continue for the spouse until such time as the spouse remarries and for a child for the period provided by the state employees' group health insurance plan for a state employee's child;
- (3) reimbursement of expenses of attendance at a licensed child care facility by any child in the officer's immediate family who is under the age of 15 years if the child's attendance at such facility is necessary due to the employment of the officer's surviving spouse;
- (4) reimbursement of mileage, and other actual and necessary expenses, incurred in travel to attend the state and national law enforcement memorial ceremonies at which the officer's name will be added to the memorial, which reimbursement shall be determined in accordance with rules and regulations of the secretary of administration for employees in the executive branch; and
- (5) reimbursement of the cost of books, equipment and materials required for the postsecondary undergraduate education of any child in the officer's immediate family.
- (d) Subject to appropriations, the following benefits shall be provided in the case of the permanent and total disability of a law enforcement officer from a duty-related cause:
- (1) A \$100,000 cash payment to the officer, or the officer's closest relative if the officer is mentally incapacitated, within 45 days after the later of the officer's last day on the law enforcement agency's payroll or the receipt by the administering agency's of the physician's (or physicians') determination of the officer's permanent and total disability;

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- (2) health insurance coverage for the officer and the officer's immediate family under the state employees' group health insurance plan, at no cost to the family, which coverage shall continue for the spouse as long as the marriage continues and for a child for the period provided for the child of a state employee who participates in the state employees' group health insurance plan;
- (3) reimbursement of expenses of attendance at a licensed child care facility by any child in the officer's immediate family who is under the age of 15 years if the child's attendance at such facility is necessary due to the employment of the officer's spouse; and
- (4) reimbursement of the cost of books, equipment and materials required for the postsecondary undergraduate education of any child in the officer's immediate family.
- (e) The benefits described in subsection (d) shall cease if the officer recovers to a degree that the officer no longer has permanent and total disability.
- (f) The provisions of this section shall be administered by the Kansas commission on peace officers' standards and training created by K.S.A. 74-5606, and amendments thereto. The commission shall determine qualifications for the benefits provided for by this section and the determination of the commission shall be final and unappealable. The commission shall adopt rules and regulations to implement and administer the provisions of this section.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
