AN ACT concerning the department of health and environment; relating to assistance for certain expenses for eosinophilic disorders.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall provide, within the limits of appropriations available therefor, the special dietary formula for eosinophilic esophagitis, eosinophilic gastritis, eosinophilic enteritis and eosinophilic colitis for a child through age 21, for as long as medically indicated, when the product is not available through other state agencies and when the child's conditions are diagnosed by an allergist, gastroenterologist or pediatrician. Where the applicable income of the person or persons who have legal responsibility for the diagnosed child meets medicaid eligibility, such child's needs shall be covered under the medicaid state plan. Where the applicable income of the person or persons who have legal responsibility for the diagnosed child is not is not medicaid eligible, but is below 300% of the federal poverty level established under the most recent poverty guidelines issued by the United States department of health and human services, the department of health and environment shall provide reimbursement of between 50% to 100% of the product cost in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of health and environment. Where the applicable income of the person or persons who have legal responsibility for the diagnosed child exceeds 300% of the federal poverty level established under the most recent poverty guidelines issued by the United States department of health and human services, the department of health and environment shall provide reimbursement of an amount not to exceed 50% of the product cost in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the secretary of health and environment.

(b) The secretary of health and environment shall provide state assistance to an applicant after it has been shown that the applicant has exhausted all benefits from private third-party payers, medicare, medicaid and other government assistance programs, and after consideration of the applicant's income and assets, and to the extent that the weekly formula cost exceeds the equivalent of weekly food costs determined under the moderate cost plan released from the United States department of

1 agriculture.

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- (c) The department of health and environment shall continue to receive orders for special dietary formulas, purchase such products and shall deliver the products to an address provided for the diagnosed child. The department of health and environment shall bill the person or persons who have legal responsibility for the diagnosed child for a pro-rata share of the total costs.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
