AN ACT creating the lifespan respite care program; concerning duties of the department of social and rehabilitation services; making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2009 and June 30, 2010.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

15 Section 1.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION SERVICES

- (a) There is appropriated for the above agency from the state general fund for the fiscal year or years specified, the following:
- 19 Lifespan respite care program

- (b) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 75-6702, and amendments thereto.
- (c) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 46- 155, and amendments thereto.
- (d) In addition to the other purposes for which expenditures may be made by the department of social and rehabilitation services from the lifespan respite care program account of the state general fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2009, and June 30, 2010, as authorized by any appropriation act of the 2008 regular session of the legislature or by any appropriation act of the 2009 regular session of the legislature, expenditures may be made by the department of social and rehabilitation services from moneys appropriated in the lifespan respite care program account of the state general fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2009, and June 30, 2010, for one additional full-time equivalent position for the lifespan respite care program established by section 2, and amendments thereto: *Provided*, That such full-time equivalent position for the lifespan respite care program shall be in addition to any limitation on the number of full-time and regular part-time positions equated to full-time estab-

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lished for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2009, and June 30, 2010, for the department of social and rehabilitation services by any appropriation act of the 2008 regular session of the legislature or by any appropriation act of the 2009 regular session of the legislature.

Sec. 2. (a) When used in this section:

- (1) "Respite care" means temporary, short-term care not exceeding 90 days per calendar year to provide relief from the daily pressures involved in caring for special needs individuals including, but not limited to, individuals receiving services pursuant to K.S.A. 76-12b01 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (2) "Lifespan respite care" means a coordinated system of accessible, community based respite care services for family caregivers of individuals with mental or physical handicaps.
 - (3) "Program" means the lifespan respite care program.
 - (4) "Secretary" means the secretary of social and rehabilitation services.
- (5) "Department" means the department of social and rehabilitation services.
- (b) (1) The secretary shall conduct a study to gather data necessary to develop a statewide lifespan respite care program. Such study shall be completed on or before November 14, 2008. The secretary of the department on aging shall provide data as needed for the completion of the study. The study shall include, but not be limited to, identifying:
- (A) The number of families who need respite care by age, disability and county;
 - (B) the funding needed to provide respite care for the families;
 - (C) the need for training for respite care providers; and
- (D) an appropriate procedure or mechanism for reimbursement to the families for the provision of respite care.
- (2) The findings and recommendations resulting from such study shall be reported to the joint legislative budget committee on or before December 15, 2008. The joint committee may request the secretary to conduct further studies or develop requests for funding or legislation to provide for the implementation of the lifespan respite care program as recommended based on the study.
- (c) Subject to the provisions of appropriation acts and the results of the study set forth in subsection (b), the secretary shall establish a lifespan respite care program within the department of social and rehabilitation services. The program shall:
- (1) Establish a respite program for primary caregivers of individuals who do not currently qualify for other publicly funded respite services;
- (2) coordinate with other respite services, including services provided pursuant to K.S.A. 76-12b01 et seq. and K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 38-142 et 42 43 seq., and amendments thereto;

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- (3) support growth and maintenance of a statewide respite coalition;
- 2 (4) provide public awareness to the community;
 - (5) identify local training resources for respite care providers; and
- 4 (6) link families with respite care providers and other types of respite caregiver consultants.
- 6 (d) The department shall establish an advisory committee that includes
 7 family caregivers and respite care providers to advise the lifespan respite
 8 care program on respite care matters. The advisory committee shall provide information and technical assistance to those involved in the program.
- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
