12 AN ACT establishing the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive 13 transportation plan. 1415 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 16Section 1. (a) There is hereby established a joint committee on the 172010 comprehensive transportation plan which shall consist of eight members of the house of representatives and seven members of the sen-1819ate. Members who are representatives shall be appointed by the speaker 20of the house of representatives. Members who are senators shall be ap-21pointed by the president of the senate. The speaker of the house of rep-22 resentatives shall designate a representative member to be chairperson 23 or vice-chairperson of the committee as provided by this section. The 24 president of the senate shall designate a senator member to be chairper-25son or vice-chairperson of the joint committee as provided by this section. 26Members All members of the joint committee on the 2010 com-(b) 27 prehensive transportation plan shall serve for a term ending on January 281, 2010, and the ensuing term shall end on July 1, 2010 terms of two 29 years ending on the first day of the regular session of the legislature 30 commencing in the first odd-numbered year after the year of ap-31pointment, except that the first members shall be appointed on July 32 1, 2008, and shall serve for terms ending on the first day of the 33 regular session of the legislature commencing in 2009. If a vacancy 34 occurs in the office of any member of the joint committee on the 35 2010 comprehensive transportation plan, a successor shall be ap-36 pointed in the same manner as the original appointment for the 37 remainder of the term. The joint committee on the 2010 comprehen-38 sive transportation plan shall not meet on or before September 30, No-39 vember 15, 2008. 40 A quorum of the joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive (c) 41transportation plan shall be eight. All actions of the committee may be 42taken by a majority of those present when there is a quorum. On and 43 after the effective date of this act until January 1, 2010, the chairperson

1 of the joint committee shall be a designated member of the senate, and 2 the vice-chairperson shall be a designated member of the house of rep-3 resentatives and on and after January 1, 2010, the chairperson shall be a designated member of the house of representatives and the vice-chair-4 person shall be a designated member of the senate. The vice-chairperson $\mathbf{5}$ 6 shall exercise all of the powers of the chairperson in the absence of the 7 chairperson. If a vacancy occurs in the office of the chairperson or 8 vice-chairperson, a member of the joint committee on the 2010 9 comprehensive transportation plan who is a member of the same house of the legislature as the member who vacated the office shall 10 be appointed by the president of the senate, if the vacating mem-11 12ber was a member of the senate, or by the speaker of the house, 13 if the vacating member was a member of the house of represen-14tatives, to fill such vacancy. 15(d) The two major political parties shall have proportional represen-16tation on such joint committee. In the event application of the preceding 17sentence results in a fraction, the party having a fraction exceeding .5 18shall receive representation as though such fraction were a whole number. 19 (e) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation

20 plan shall meet on call of the chairperson as authorized by the legislative 21 coordinating council. Members of such joint committee shall receive 22 compensation and travel expenses and subsistence expenses or allowances 23 as provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto, when attending 24 meetings of such joint committee authorized by the legislative coordi-25 nating council.

(f) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation
plan shall have the services of the legislative research department, the
office of the revisor of statutes and other central legislative staff service
agencies.

(g) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transportation
plan shall study, monitor, review and make recommendations for the
following:

(1) Conditions and adequacy of the state highway system, including
 road surface and bridge conditions;

(2) the condition <u>and extent</u> of the state **multimodal** transportation
 system <u>and infrastructure, including, but not limited to, railroads, airports,</u>
 <u>trucks and public transit; and</u>, including infrastructure issues related
 to such multimodal transportation system;

(3) the condition and issues related to the trucking industry,
 railroads, airports and public transportation; and

41 (3)/(4) issues relating to transportation needs to be addressed in the
 42 next comprehensive transportation plan legislation including financing
 43 options and priorities for funding.

1 (h) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transpor-2 tation may introduce such legislation as deemed necessary in per-

3 forming its function.

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4 (h) (i) The joint committee on the 2010 comprehensive transporta5 tion plan shall submit a written report to the legislature on or before
6 December 31, 2008, December 31, 2009 and December 31, 2010.

(i) (j) The provisions of this section shall expire on July 1, $\frac{2010}{2011}$.
