## **SENATE BILL No. 704**

By Senators Pine, Francisco and Taddiken

9 AN ACT concerning appropriation of water for beneficial use; relating 10 to public wholesale water supply districts located in Douglas county; amending Section 1 of 2008 Senate Substitute for House Bill No. 2860 11 12and repealing the existing section. 13 14Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15 Section 1. Section 1 of 2008 Senate Substitute for House Bill No. 162860 is hereby amended to read as follows: (a) Notwithstanding any other 17provision of law to the contrary, the chief engineer shall not approve an application for a permit to appropriate water submitted on or after Jan-18uary 1, 2008 2007, by any public wholesale water supply district located 1920in Douglas county or by any public agency, as defined in K.S.A. 19-3546, 21and amendments thereto, that has entered into an agreement for the 22 purpose of organizing any public wholesale water supply district located 23 in Douglas county pursuant to K.S.A. 19-3547, and amendments thereto, 24 unless such district or such public agency acquired legal access to the 25proposed point of diversion: 26Prior to January 1, 2008; (1)27 (2)by voluntary means including, but not limited to, purchase or gift; 28or 29 by means other than voluntary, not less than 10 years prior to (3)30 application for such permit. 31(b) The provisions of this section shall be a part of and supplemental 32 to the Kansas water appropriation act. 33 (c) In the 2008 and 2009 interim, a special committee designated by 34 the legislative coordinating council shall study and investigate issues con-35 cerning the use of eminent domain as it relates to water rights and other 36 issues concerning water rights. The provisions of this section shall expire on June 30, 2010. 37 (d) 38 Sec. 2. Section 1 of 2008 Senate Substitute for House Bill No. 2860 39 is hereby repealed. 40 Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its 41publication in the Kansas register.
