9 AN ACT establishing the advisory council on pain and symptom 10 management. 11 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 12 13

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- Section 1. (a) There is hereby established within the department of health and environment the advisory council on pain and symptom management. The council shall consist of 19 members who are residents of this state. The members of the council shall include:
- The secretary of health and environment, or the secretary's designee, who shall serve as chair of the council;
 - the state attorney general, or the attorney general's designee;
- one member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate;
- (4) one member of the senate, appointed by the minority leader of the senate;
- one member of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
- (6) one member of the house of representatives, appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives;
- one person licensed to practice medicine and surgery in this state, appointed by the state board of healing arts who is knowledgeable in pain management;
- (8) one person licensed to practice medicine and surgery in this state, appointed by the state board of healing arts who is knowledgeable in palliative care;
- (9) two licensed professional nurses, appointed by the state board of nursing, with expertise in hospice, oncology, long-term care or pain and symptom management;
- one dentist, appointed by the Kansas dental board, with training in pain and symptom management who is associated with the education and training of dental students;
- one pharmacist, appointed by the state board of pharmacy, with training in pain and symptom management who is associated with the education and training of pharmacists;
 - one representative of the pharmaceutical research and manufac-

turers of America, appointed by the governor;

- (13) one mental health services provider, appointed by the governor;
- (14) one physician assistant, appointed by the state board of healing arts, with training in pain and symptom management;
- (15) one chiropractic physician, appointed by the state board of healing arts, with training in pain and symptom management;
- (16) one physical therapist, appointed by the state board of healing arts, who specializes in pain management;
- (17) one advocate representing voluntary health organizations or advocacy groups with an interest in pain management, appointed by the governor; and
- (18) one individual who has been diagnosed with chronic pain, appointed by the governor.
- (b) The council shall advise the secretary of health and environment on matters relating to the diagnosis and treatment of pain, therapeutic modalities relating thereto and treatment consistent with patient needs and sound clinical practice. The secretary shall report annually on or before the commencement of the legislative session to the governor and the legislature the activities of the council during the preceding year and any recommendations of the council concerning matters under review by the council.
- (c) Members appointed to the council shall serve for terms of two years. The members shall continue to serve until such member's successor is duly appointed and qualified. Any vacancy on the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. The council shall meet on the call of its chairperson. Members of the council attending meetings of the council shall be paid travel and other expenses as may be authorized by the secretary of health and environment.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
