9 AN ACT concerning educational requirements for licensure as a health care provider.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "Appropriate licensing agency" means an agency that issues a license to a health care provider.
- (2) "Distance-learning" means those technologies which predominately use internet-based methods to deliver instruction.
- (3) "Health care provider" means: A person licensed to practice any branch of the healing arts by the state board of healing arts, a podiatrist licensed by the state board of healing arts, a physician assistant licensed by the state board of healing arts, an optometrist licensed by the board of examiners in optometry, a pharmacist licensed by the state board of pharmacy, a dentist licensed by the Kansas dental board, a dental hygienist licensed by the Kansas dental board, a professional nurse licensed by the board of nursing, a mental health technician licensed by the board of nursing, a physical therapist licensed by the state board of healing arts, a physical therapist assistant certified by the state board of healing arts, an occupational therapist licensed by the state board of healing arts and a respiratory therapist licensed by the state board of healing arts and a respiratory therapist licensed by the state board of healing arts.
- (4) "License," "licensure" and "licensing" include comparable terms which relate to licensure regulation and regulation similar to licensure, such as registration.
- (b) In each case where passage of an examination is required as one of the qualifications for licensure as a health care provider and where educational course work is a prerequisite for taking the examination, and notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, course credit obtained through distance-learning which meets in whole or in part the required educational course work as determined by the appropriate licensing agency shall be applied by the appropriate licensing agency as meeting in whole or in part the educational course work required to take the licensure examination. The provisions of this subsection shall only apply if the

- distance-learning is approved by the relevant educational credentialing authority and is approved by the appropriate licensing agency as substantially the same quality as other educational courses approved to meet the educational requirement to take the examination for licensure for the particular classification of health care provider.
- 6 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
