AN ACT concerning persons licensed in the state to practice medicine and surgery; right of participation as a provider in health benefits programs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) No policy of group health insurance providing benefits for hospital and medical expenses delivered in this state that is offered by an accident and health insurance company, by a nonprofit medical and surgical plan corporation, by a nonprofit hospital service plan corporation, by a health maintenance organization, by a preferred provider organization, by an individual practice association or by a similar mechanism may:

- (1) Deny a person licensed in this state to practice medicine and surgery the right to participate as a provider for any policy or plan on the same terms and conditions as are offered to any other provider of medical and surgical services under the policy or plan; or
- (2) prevent any person who is a party to or beneficiary of any health insurance policy from selecting a person licensed in this state to practice medicine and surgery to furnish the medical and surgical services offered under any policy or plan, under the same terms and conditions of the policy or plan as those offered to any other provider of medical and surgical services.
- (b) All health benefit programs, as specified in subsection (a), and amendments thereto, shall provide an annual period of enrollment of at least 30 days during which period any person licensed in this state to practice medicine and surgery may elect to participate in the plan under the terms and conditions then offered unless the person licensed in this state to practice medicine and surgery has lost status as a provider due to failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the provider agreement. Health benefit programs are not required to provide actual notice of the period of open enrollment to the person licensed in this state to practice medicine and surgery for medical and surgical services.
- (c) Any provision in an accident and health insurance policy offered in this state which violates the provisions of subsection (a) is void.
- (d) The department of insurance shall enforce the provisions of this act.
