WHEREAS, The on-going contributions made by cowboys to their communities should be recognized and encouraged: Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas, the Senate concurring therein: That we designate the fourth Saturday in July as National Day of the Cowboy and that we encourage the people of Kansas to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
