## SENATE BILL No. 103

By Committee on Ethics and Elections

> AN ACT concerning elections; relating to certain primary elections; amending K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 25-2021, 25-2108a and 71-1415 and repealing the existing sections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
Section 1. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 25-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2021. (a) A primary election shall be held if needed to reduee the number of eandidates for each offiee in the general election to ne more than three candidates. No primary election of sehool distriet board members shall be held unless by holding sueh primary two or more persons will be eliminated as candidates for offiee. In the event there are not more than three times the number of eandidates as there are board members to be elected, the names of the eandidates for steh offiee shatl not appear on the primary eleetion ballots, and there shall be no primary election for sueh offiee, but the names of sueh eandidates shall be placed on the general sehool board election ballot. In school districts in which a member district method of election is in effect, if there are more than two qualified candidates for one member position in any member district, the county election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election in each such member district and, if there are more than two qualified candidates for the at-large member position, the county election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election in such school district. The names of the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes for any member position at the primary election shall appear on the ballots in the general election.
(b) In school districts having the election at large method, if there are more than two times the number of candidates as there are board members to be elected, the county election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of twice the number of candidates as there are board members to be elected who received the greatest number of votes at the primary election shall appear on the ballots in the general election.
(c) If a member is to be elected to fill an unexpired term the rules in this section shall be modified consistent with the provisions of this subsection. If there are more than two candidates for such unexpired term,
the county election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of the two candidates for such unexpired term receiving the greatest number of votes shall appear on the ballots in the general election.
(d) No ballot in a primary school election shall have either names or write-in blanks for any board member position unless more than two candidates have filed for such position.
(b) (e) On the ballots in general school elections, blank lines for the name of write-in candidates shall be printed at the end of the list of candidates for each different office equal to the number to be elected thereto. The purpose of such blank lines shall be to permit the voter to insert the name of any person not printed on the ballot for whom such voter desires to vote for such office. No lines for write-in candidates shall appear on primary school election ballots.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 25-2108a is hereby amended to read as follows: 25-2108a. (a) There shall be a primary election of city officers on the Tuesday preceding by five weeks the first Tuesday in April of every year that such city has a city election, except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section.
(b) A primary eleetion shall be held if needed to reduee the number of eandidates for each offiee in the general election to no more than three eandidates. No primary election of eity offieers shall be held unless by holding sueh primay two or more persoms will be eliminated as eandidates for offiee. In the event there are not more than three times the ntmber of eandidates as there are offieers to be elected, the names of the eandidates for such office shall not appear on the primary election ballots, and there shall be no primary election for steh offiee, but the names of such candidates shall be placed on the general eity election ballot.
(b) No primary election of city officers shall be held unless by holding such primary one or more persons will be eliminated as candidates for office. In the event there are not more than two candidates for any one office, the names of the candidates for such office shall not appear on the primary election ballots, and there shall be no primary election for such office, but the names of such candidates shall be placed on the general city election ballot.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. $71-1415$ is hereby amended to read as follows: 71-1415. (a) A primary election shall be held if needed to reduce the number of eandidates for each offiee in the general election to no more than three eandidates. No primary election of trustees shall be held unless by holding sueh primay two or more persons will be eliminated as eandidates for offiee. In the event there are not more than three times the number of eandidates as there are trustees to be elected, the names
of the eandidates for sueh offiee shall not appear on the primary eleetion ballots, and there shall be no primary election for such offiee, but the names of steh eandidates shall be plaeed on the general election ballot for the board of trustees. In any college district having a district method and in which there are more than two candidates for a member position, the election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of the two candidates receiving the greatest number of votes for any member position shall appear on the ballots in the general election.
(b) In any college district having the election-at-large method and in which there are more than two times the number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected, the election officer shall call, and there shall be held, a primary election. The names of twice the number of candidates as there are trustees to be elected who receive the greatest number of votes in the primary shall appear on the ballots in the general election.
(b) (c) In the general election, there shall appear on the ballots a line appropriate for write-in candidates. No lines for write-in candidates shall appear on the primary election ballots.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 25-2021, 25-2108a and 71-1415 are hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
