12AN ACT concerning motor carriers; relating to regulation thereof; 13 amending K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 66-1,129 and repealing the existing 14section. 1516 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 17Section 1. K.S.A. 2008 Supp. 66-1,129 is hereby amended to read as 18follows: 66-1,129. (a) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations 19necessary to carry out the provisions of this act. No public motor carrier 20of property, household goods or passengers or private motor carrier of 21property shall operate or allow the operation of any motor vehicle on any 22 public highway in this state except within the provisions of the rules and 23 regulations adopted by the commission. Rules and regulations adopted 24 by the commission shall include: 25(1) Every vehicle unit shall be maintained in a safe and sanitary con-26dition at all times. 27 (2)Every driver of a public motor carrier, operating as a carrier of 28intrastate commerce within this state, shall be at least 18 years of age. 29 Every driver of a private motor carrier, operating as a carrier of intrastate 30 commerce within this state, shall be at least 16 years of age. All such 31drivers shall be competent to operate the motor vehicle under such 32 driver's charge. 33 (3)Minimum age requirements for every driver of a motor carrier, 34 operating as a carrier of interstate commerce, shall be consistent with 35 federal motor carrier regulations. 36 (4) Hours of service for operators of all motor carriers to which this 37 act applies shall be fixed by the commission. 38 (5) Accidents arising from or in connection with the operation of mo-39 tor carriers shall be reported to the commission within the time, in the 40 detail and in the manner as the commission requires. 41Every motor carrier shall have attached to each unit or vehicle (6)42distinctive marking adopted by the commission. 43 (7)Motor carrier transportation requirements that are consistent with continuation of the federal motor carrier safety assistance program
 and other federal requirements concerning transportation of hazardous
 materials.

4 (8) Every public motor carrier or private motor carrier who 5 operates on any street, highway, road, alley or parking lot in the

6 state, a motor vehicle with a load of gravel which has the potential,

7 due to the nature of the load to spill, drop, blow or otherwise escape,

8 shall have a cover, which cover shall be securely fastened so as to

9 prevent such cover or the load from spilling, dropping, blowing, or
 10 otherwise escaping or in any manner becoming a hazard to other

11 users of such street, highway, road, alley or parking lot.

12 (9) Every public motor carrier or private motor carrier who

13 operates a motor vehicle, including, but not limited to, trucks or

14 trailers, with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less,

15 with a load above the sidewalls of a truck bed or trailer which has

16 the potential because of the nature of the load, to drop, leak, blow 17 or otherwise escape from the motor vehicle shall be adequately

18 strapped to fasten the load securely to the vehicle.

(b) No rules and regulations adopted by the commission pursuant to
this section shall require the operator of any motor vehicle having a gross
vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating of not more than
10,000 pounds to submit to a physical examination, unless required by
federal laws or regulations.

(c) Any *Except as provided in paragraph (3), any* [*Any*] rules and
regulations of the commission, adopted pursuant to this section, shall not
apply to the following, while engaged in the carriage of intrastate commerce in this state:

(1) The owner of livestock or producer of farm products transporting livestock of such owner or farm products of such producer to market in a motor vehicle of such owner or producer, or the motor vehicle of a neighbor on the basis of barter or exchange for service or employment, or to such owner or producer transporting supplies for the use of such owner or producer in or producer, or in the motor vehicle of a neighbor on the basis of barter or exchange for service or employment.

(2) The transportation of children to and from school, or to motor vehicles owned by schools, colleges, and universities, religious or charitable organizations and institutions, or governmental agencies, when used to convey students, inmates, employees, athletic teams, orchestras, bands or other similar activities.

40 (3) (A) Except for motor vehicles under subparagraph (B), motor vehicles, with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less, carrying
 42 tools, property or material belonging to the owner of the vehicle, and

43 used in repair, building or construction work, not having been sold or

1 being transported for the purpose of sale, except vehicles transporting 2 hazardous materials which require placards. 3 (B) Except vehicles transporting hazardous materials which require placards, motor vehicles, with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 4 pounds or less, carrying tools, property or material belonging to the owner 5 6 of the vehiele and used in repair, building or construction work and such 7 tools, property or material are being transported to or from an active 8 construction site located within a radius of 25 miles of the principal place 9 of business of the motor earrier. 10(4) Persons (A) Except for motor vehicles under subparagraph (B), motor vehicles, with a gross vehicle weight rating of 26,000 11 12pounds or less, carrying tools, property or material belonging to the owner of the vehicle, and used in repair, building or construction 13 14work, not having been sold or being transported for the purpose of 15sale, except vehicles transporting hazardous materials which re-16quire placards, and except that such motor vehicles shall be subject 17to rules and regulations adopted pursuant to paragraphs (8) and (9) of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 66-1,129, and amendments thereto. 1819 (B) Except vehicles transporting hazardous materials which re-20quire placards, motor vehicles, with a gross vehicle weight rating 21of 26,000 pounds or less, carrying tools, property or material be-22 longing to the owner of the vehicle and used in repair, building or 23 construction work and such tools, property or material are being 24 transported to or from an active construction site located within a 25radius of 25 miles of the principal place of business of the motor 26carrier, except that such motor vehicles shall be subject to rules and 27 regulations adopted pursuant to paragraphs (8) and (9) of subsec-28tion (a) of K.S.A. 66-1,129, and amendments thereto.

[(C) (1) Such motor vehicles described in paragraphs (A) and
(B) which are carrying a load shall be required to have a cover
which shall be securely fastened to prevent the cover or load from
spilling or becoming a hazard to other motor vehicle users.

[(2) Such motor vehicles described in paragraphs (A) and (B)
 which are carrying a load above the sidewalls of a truck bed or
 trailer shall be adequately strapped to securely fasten the load to
 the vehicle.]

(4) Persons operating motor vehicles which have an ad valorem tax
situs in and are registered in the state of Kansas, and used only to transport grain from the producer to an elevator or other place for storage or
sale for a distance of not to exceed 50 miles.

41 (5)(4)(5) The operation of hearses, funeral coaches, funeral cars or 42 ambulances by motor carriers.

43 (6)(5)(6) Motor vehicles owned and operated by the United States,

the District of Columbia, any state, any municipality or any other political
 subdivisions of this state.

3 (7) (6) (7) Any motor vehicle with a normal seating capacity of not 4 more than the driver and 15 passengers while used for vanpooling or 5otherwise not for profit in transporting persons who, as a joint undertak-6 ing, bear or agree to bear all the costs of such operations, or motor ve-7 hicles with a normal seating capacity not more than the driver and 15 8 passengers for not-for-profit transportation by one or more employers of 9 employees to and from the factories, plants, offices, institutions, construc-10 tion sites or other places of like nature where such persons are employed or accustomed to work. 11 12 (8) (7) (8) Motor vehicles used to transport water for domestic pur-13 poses, as defined by subsection (c) of K.S.A. 82a-701, and amendments 14

thereto, or livestock consumption.
(9) The operation of vehicles used for servicing, repairing or transporting of implements of husbandry, as defined in K.S.A. 8-1427, and amendments thereto, by a person actively engaged in the business of buying, selling or exchanging implements of husbandry, if such operation is within 100 miles of such person's established place of business in this state, unless the implement of husbandry is transported on a commercial

21 motor vehicle.
