AN ACT concerning the secretary of health and environment; relating to powers and duties; fingerprinting and criminal history records checks for certain employees; amending K.S.A. 65-2402 and repealing the existing section.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 65-2402 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-2402. The secretary shall: (a) (1) Establish within the division of health suitable offices properly equipped for the preservation of official records. (2) Maintain a complete cross-index on all records filed under the provisions of this act. (3) Install a statewide system of vital statistics. (4) Make and may amend, after notice and hearing, necessary regulations, give instructions and prescribe forms for collection, transcribing, compiling and preserving vital statistics. (5) Enforce this act and the regulations made pursuant thereto.

Upon the selection of a top candidate for a position in the center for health and environmental statistics, the top candidate shall be given a written notice that a criminal history records check is required. The secretary shall require such candidates to be fingerprinted and submit to a state and national criminal history record check. The fingerprints shall be used to identify the candidate and to determine whether the candidate has a record of criminal history in this state or another jurisdiction. The secretary shall submit the fingerprints to the Kansas bureau of investigation and the federal bureau of investigation for a state and national criminal history record check. Local and state law enforcement officers and agencies shall assist the secretary in taking and processing of fingerprints of candidates. If the criminal history record information reveals any conviction of felony crimes or misdemeanor crimes against the public trust, such conviction may be used to disqualify a candidate for any position within the center for health and environmental statistics. If the criminal history record information is used to disqualify a candidate, the candidate shall be informed in writing of that decision. Probationary appointments may be made, but permanent appointments shall be dependent upon the results of the criminal history record check.

(c) Except as provided in subsection (d), all persons employed by the

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1 center for health and environmental statistics shall be fingerprinted and submit to a state and national criminal history record check. The finger-2 3 prints shall be used to identify the employee and to determine whether the employee has a record of criminal history in this state or another 4 jurisdiction. The secretary shall submit the fingerprints to the Kansas bureau of investigation and federal bureau of investigation for a state and 6 national criminal history record check. Local and state law enforcement officers and agencies shall assist the center for health and environmental 8 9 statistics in taking and processing of fingerprints of employees. If the criminal history record information reveals any conviction of felony 10 crimes or misdemeanor crimes of dishonesty, identity theft or fraud, such 11 conviction may be used to terminate an employee in any position within 12 the center for health and environmental statistics. If the criminal history 13 record information is used to terminate an employee, the employee shall 14 15 be informed in writing of that decision. Except as provided in subsection 16 (d), a criminal history record check may be repeated on any person employed by the center for health and environmental statistics at the discre-17 18 tion of the secretary. 19

- (d) No person who has been employed by the center for health and environmental statistics for five consecutive years immediately prior to the effective date of this act shall be subject to the provisions of subsection (c) while employed by the center for health and environmental statistics.
