AN ACT concerning energy; requiring schools of engineering to evaluate renewable, distributive generation and transmission technology upon request.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) The Kansas technology enterprise corporation, the Kansas bioscience authority, the state corporation commission or the secretary of health and environment may request the school of engineering of any institution under the supervision and control of the state board of regents to evaluate any innovative renewable or distributive energy generation technology, or innovative energy transmission technology, patented by a Kansas resident. Upon such request, the school shall conduct an evaluation of the technology and report the technological feasibility of the technology to the requesting entity. If the school identifies the technology as feasible, the requesting entity shall refer the technology to the department of commerce and to the Kansas technology enterprise corporation for possible commercial development.

- (b) Annually on or before the first day of each regular legislative session, the school of engineering of each institution under the supervision and control of the state board of regents shall submit to the house standing committee on energy and utilities and the senate standing committee on utilities, or their successors, a written report of all requests made to the school pursuant to this section and the school's report on the technological feasibility of the technology.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
