## HOUSE BILL No. 2463

AN ACT concerning taxation; establishing the committee on simplified state tax structure; prescribing membership, duties and responsibilities thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the committee on simplified state tax structure. The committee shall study the overall tax structure and policy of the state of Kansas by reviewing the relationship of the various taxes imposed by the state to each other and to the economy and identify a tax structure that operates in the best interests of Kansas citizens with a goal to formulate a fair, simple and effective tax structure. The committee shall particularly study ways to decrease tax rates of such taxes imposed by the state by broadening the tax base upon which each tax is imposed, and study the effects of the imposition of a fair, flat or consumption tax or a flat, simplified Kansas income tax, including what taxes currently imposed by the state might be eliminated and be replaced by imposition of such tax.

- (b) The committee on simplified state tax structure shall consist of 11 members. Of such 11 members, six shall be members of the house of representatives and five shall be members of the senate. The house of representatives members shall be the chairperson, vice-chairperson and ranking minority member of the committee on taxation, two members appointed by the speaker of the house and one member appointed by the minority leader of the house. The senate members shall be the chairperson, vice-chairperson and ranking minority leader of the committee on assessment and taxation, one member appointed by the president of the senate and one member appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
- (c) Commencing July 1, 2010, the chairperson of the committee on taxation of the house of representatives shall be chairperson of the committee on simplified state tax structure, and commencing July 1, 2011, the chairperson of the committee on assessment and taxation of the senate shall be chairperson of the committee on simplified state tax structure. Any vacancy in the membership of the committee on simplified state tax structure shall be filled by appointment in the manner prescribed by this

section for the original appointment.

- (d) A quorum of the committee on simplified state tax structure shall be six members. All actions of the committee shall be taken by a majority of all of the members of the committee.
- (e) The committee on simplified state tax structure shall meet during the 2010 and 2011 interims and shall meet five times during each interim. During each interim the committee shall meet two times in Topeka and one time in a location chosen by the committee in congressional districts one, three and four to provide the opportunity for full citizen input for the committee's consideration in making the committee's findings and recommendations.
- (f) The provisions of the acts contained in article 12 of chapter 46 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, applicable to special committees shall apply to the committee on simplified state tax structure to the extent that the same do not conflict with the specific provisions of this act applicable to the committee.
- (g) Members of the committee on simplified state tax structure shall receive compensation, travel expenses and subsistence expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3212, and amendments thereto, when attending meetings of the committee.
- (h) The staff of the office of revisor of statutes, the Kansas legislative research department and other central legislative staff service agencies, and professors from not more than three regents institutions as chosen by the chairperson of the committee, shall provide such assistance as may be requested by the committee.
- (i) The committee on simplified state tax structure may introduce such legislation as it deems necessary in performing its functions.
- (j) The committee on simplified state tax structure shall submit a report to the legislature and to the committee on taxation of the house of representatives and the committee on assessment and taxation of the senate before December 31, 2010, and December 31, 2011, with any findings and recommendations which such committee deems necessary.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
