AN ACT concerning the consumer protection act; making any adverse effect on a consumer's credit caused by a health care provider's reporting of a consumer's failure to pay for services provided an uncon-12 scionable act.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no consumer's credit worthiness, credit standing or credit capacity shall be adversely affected by any health care provider who reports to a consumer reporting agency that the consumer has failed to pay or arrange for payment of a bill for services provided by the health care provider.

- (b) Each violation of subsection (a) by either a health care provider or a consumer reporting agency shall be deemed to be an unconscionable act within the meaning of K.S.A. 50-627, and amendments thereto, and subject to the penalties authorized under the Kansas consumer protection act, K.S.A. 50-623 et seq., and amendments thereto.
 - For the purposes of this act, the term:
- "Consumer reporting agency" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in K.S.A. 50-702 and amendments thereto.
- (2) "Health care provider" shall have the meaning ascribed to the term "provider" in K.S.A. 40-4602 and amendments thereto.
- (d) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the Kansas consumer protection act.
