HOUSE BILL No. 2727

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AN ACT concerning the department of revenue; relating to certain drivers' licenses and identification cards; protection of privacy rights.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision under article 2 of chapter 8, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto, or K.S.A. 8-1324 and 8-1325, and amendments thereto, that requires an applicant to provide reasonable proof of residence for issuance or renewal of a driver's license, instruction permit or nondriver's identification card, an applicant shall not have their privacy rights violated in order to obtain or renew a Kansas driver's license, instruction permit, or nondriver's identification card. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to driver's licenses issued pursuant to the Kansas uniform commercial driver's license act.

- (b) Any data derived from a person's application shall not be sold for commercial purposes to any other organization or any other state without the express permission of the applicant or without a court order; except such information may be shared with a law enforcement agency, judge, prosecuting attorney or officer of the court, or with another state, or for conducting driver history checks in compliance with the motor carrier safety improvement act, 49 U.S.C. 31309. The state of Kansas shall protect the privacy of its citizens when handling any written, digital or electronic data and shall not participate in any standardized identification system using driver's license and nondriver's identification card records.
- (c) The department of revenue shall not amend procedures for applying for a driver's license or nondriver identification card in order to comply with the goals or standards of the federal REAL ID act of 2005, any rules and regulations promulgated under the authority granted in such act, or any requirements adopted by the American association of motor vehicle administrators for furtherance of the act.
- (d) Any biometric data previously collected, obtained or retained in connection with motor vehicle registration or operation, the issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or the issuance or renewal of any nondriver identification cards by the department of revenue shall be retrieved and deleted from all databases. The provisions of this subsection shall not

apply to any data collected, obtained or retained for a purpose other than compliance with the federal REAL ID act of 2005. For purposes of this 3 subsection, "biometric data" includes, but is not limited to:

- (1) Facial feature pattern characteristics;
- (2) voice data used for comparing live speech with a previously created speech model of a person's voice; 6
 - (3) iris recognition data containing color or texture patterns or codes;
- (4) retinal scans, reading through the pupil to measure blood vessels 8 9 lining the retina;
- (5) fingerprint, palm prints, hand geometry, measuring of any and all 10 characteristics of biometric information, including shape and length of 11 fingertips or recording ridge pattern or fingertip characteristics; 12
 - eye spacing;

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- characteristic gait or walk; (7)
- (8)DNA; and
- keystroke dynamics, measuring pressure applied to key pads or other digital receiving devices.
- 18 (e) No citizen of this state shall have their privacy compromised by the state or agents of the state. The state shall within reason protect the 20 sovereignty of the citizens the state is entrusted to protect.
- 21 Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
