AN ACT concerning school districts; relating to the reorganization thereof; amending K.S.A. 75-1124 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-7536, 72-8253 and 72-8254 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-6441, 72-6445a, 72-6451 and 72-6452.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

New Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the school district reorganization act.

New Sec. 2. As used in the school district reorganization act, and amendments thereto:

- (a) "Regional education service center" means a provider of administrative, technical, training, purchasing and accounting services to school districts.
- (b) "School district" or "district" means a public school district which provides instructional resource coordination to attendance centers located in the district and which has a full-time equivalent enrollment of at least 10,000 on September 20th of each school year.
- (c) "Superintendent" means the person appointed by the board of education of a school district pursuant to K.S.A. 72-8202b, and amendments thereto, to manage the day-to-day operations of the school district.
- (d) "Board of education" means the board of education of a school district.
- (e) "Attendance center" means a building or structure in which instruction is provided to pupils enrolled in the district.
- (f) "Reorganization commission" or "commission" means the school district reorganization commission established by section 3, and amendments thereto.
 - (g) "State board" means the state board of education.
- New Sec. 3. (a) There is hereby established the school district reorganization commission. The commission shall consist of 11 members as follows:
- (1) One member appointed by the governor.
- (2) One member appointed by the president of the senate.
- 42 (3) One member appointed by the speaker of the house of 43 representatives.

- (4) One member appointed by the state board.
- (5) Four members, one from each of the congressional districts of the state, who are superintendents and who shall be appointed by the united school administrators.
- (6) Three members who are school board members and who are appointed by the Kansas association of school boards. Of such members, one shall reside in the eastern region of the state, one shall reside in the central region of the state and one shall reside in the western region of the state.
- (b) Members of the commission shall be citizens of the United States and shall be residents of the state of Kansas.
- (c) Members of the commission shall be appointed not later than 60 days after the effective date of this act.
- (d) Members of the commission attending meetings of the commission, or attending a subcommittee meeting thereof authorized by the commission, shall be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided in K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.
- (e) Members of the commission shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
- New Sec. 4. (a) The commission shall select one member of the commission to serve as chairperson of the commission.
- (b) The commission shall meet upon call of the chairperson at least once each month and may meet at any time and at any place within the state, subject to provisions of appropriation acts.
- (c) School districts and their officers and employees shall cooperate fully with the commission in the discharge of the commission's duties.
- (d) The staff of the state department of education shall provide such assistance as requested by the commission. In addition, the staff of the office of revisor of statutes, the Kansas legislative research department and the division of legislative administrative services shall provide such assistance as requested by the commission, to the extent authorized by the legislative coordinating council.
- New Sec. 5. (a) On or before January 1, 2011, and each 10 years thereafter, school districts throughout Kansas shall be reorganized so that each district has a full-time equivalent enrollment of at least 10,000.
- (b) The boundaries of school districts shall be determined by the school district reorganization commission.
- (c) The full-time equivalent enrollment of districts shall be based on the most current enrollment data available as certified by the state board. In no case shall such enrollment data be more than two years old.
- New Sec. 6. (a) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, each school district shall be governed by a seven-member board

 of education. Six members of the board shall be elected from equally populated regions within each district and one member of the board shall be elected from the district on an at-large basis. Except as otherwise provided by law and this section, members of the board shall hold office for a term of four years.

- (2) The first reorganized school district board election shall be held on or before April 15, 2011 and newly-elected board members shall take office on July 1, 2011.
- (3) Members elected to even-numbered board member positions shall serve for terms of two years commencing on the July 1, 2011. Persons elected to odd-numbered member positions and the at-large position shall serve for terms of four years commencing on the July 1, 2011 following such election. Thereafter, school board members shall be elected to serve for terms of four years.
- (b) All electors, who are otherwise qualified according to law, and who reside in a particular member district may vote in both the primary and general election for the member positions of such member district and for the at-large member position.
- (c) The board of education of the school district shall be responsible for budget adoption, policy review and development, strategic planning and oversight of the curriculum to assure that students are achieving state education standards.
- (d) A superintendent shall be hired by the board of education of the district and shall be responsible for the administration and supervision of the instructional resources of the district.
 - (e) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2010.
- New Sec. 7. (a) Upon the reorganization of school districts pursuant to this act, the consolidated school district shall assume and agree to pay all of the bonded indebtedness of the former school districts of which it is comprised, unless the commission determines that the bonded indebtedness shall remain a charge upon the territory of the school districts being disorganized. If the bonded indebtedness is to remain a charge upon the territory of the school districts being disorganized, the provisions of K.S.A. 10-119, and amendments thereto, shall apply with the date of the disorganization of such school districts being the date to be used in making such application.
 - (b) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2012.

New Sec. 8. (a) The assets of the school districts being consolidated pursuant to this act shall be transferred to the consolidated school district on a day determined by the commission but not sooner than the first day of the first month after the reorganization takes effect. The property, records and all funds on hand and to be collected of each of the school districts being consolidated shall be turned over and paid to the consol-

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1 idated school district and shall become the property of the consolidated school district, and the consolidated school district shall thereupon be 2 3 entitled to possession thereof. The consolidated school district shall thereupon become liable for and pay all lawful debts of the school districts 4 which were consolidated except as may be otherwise provided by the commission for bonded indebtedness. It shall be the duty of all county 6 officers and officers of the school districts being consolidated to transfer 8 the funds (including state foundation finance funds and funds collected 9 from state aid, taxes, interests and penalties subsequent to such reorganization), records and property of the school districts being consolidated 10 in accordance with the provisions of this section. Any county treasurer or 11 12 school district officer or former officer having in the officer's or former 13 officer's possession any property, records or funds of any of the school districts being consolidated who shall fail or refuse to turn over such 14 15 property, records or funds to the consolidated school district shall be 16 ordered to do so by the state board.

(b) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2012.

New Sec. 9. (a) In order to reduce unnecessary duplication within and between school districts, improve coordination and reduce costs, each regional education service center shall serve the school districts within the service center's region. Service centers may also contract to provide services to school districts outside their region.

- (b) The powers and duties of each regional education service center shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) Bulk purchasing of textbooks, supplies and equipment, furniture and other items.
- (2) Development of tests and other tools for student evaluation, coordination, data analysis and reporting.
- (3) Curriculum development to meet any state, federal or vocational education certification standards.
 - (4) Professional development and other training.
- (5) Administration, coordination and supervision of special education and related services.
 - (6) Administration and supervision of Title I programs.
- (7) Administration and supervision of English language learner programs.
- (8) Administration and supervision of student transportation and scheduling thereof.
- (9) Purchasing, preparation and delivery of food service to each attendance center.
- (10) Administration, purchasing and coordination of custodial services.
- 43 (11) Provision of maintenance support and specialty services to at-

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1 tendance centers or other school buildings located within the district.

- 2 (12) Payroll processing, benefits administration, accounting and 3 reporting.
- 4 (13) Group health insurance negotiation, administration and 5 reporting.
 - (14) Coordination of charter and diploma completion schools.
 - (15) Administration and coordination of human resources for licensed and nonlicensed personnel.
 - (16) Purchasing and providing for the sharing between attendance centers, of specialty equipment.
 - (17) Administration, coordination and support of career and technical education, computer networking and web services.
- 13 (18) Compilation, preparation and submission of state and federal 14 reports.
 - (19) Any other power or duty prescribed by the state board.
 - (c) Each regional education service center shall impose fees to pay the cost of services provided.
 - (d) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2012.
 - New Sec. 10. (a) Between July 1, 2011 and July 1, 2012, the board of education of each reorganized school district and the superintendent shall develop and implement plans to optimize the use of attendance centers, teachers, staff and other resources within their boundaries.
 - (b) These plans shall be developed after input from public meetings with citizens, parents, teachers and administrators of the school districts being reorganized.
 - (c) Cooperative and administrative responsibility agreements with one or more regional educational service centers also shall be negotiated and finalized on or before July 1, 2012.
 - (d) From and after July 1, 2012, the board of education of each school district shall:
 - (1) Provide leadership, vision, planning and implementation of the instructional programs for students attending schools within the district.
 - (2) Provide distance learning.
 - (3) Coordinate the administration of district-level instructional, evaluation and data collection.
 - (4) Implement a curriculum which meets the standards established by the state board and coordinate instructional programs in the attendance centers within the school district.
 - (5) Prepare the budget of the district and of each attendance center plus coordinate district level budget administration and reporting.
 - (6) Provide for the central administration of the district.
- 42 (7) Administer, supervise and coordinate, intramural and inter-school sports and other extracurricular activities.

- (8) Perform any other duty required by the state board.
- 2 (9) Implement and adhere to a statewide uniform accounting and 3 reporting system prescribed by the state board.
 - (e) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2011.

New Sec. 11. (a) The principal or teacher assigned to administer each attendance center shall:

- (1) Provide staffing assignments as necessary to meet the curriculum standards of the state board.
- (2) Coordinate and make optimal use of the resources at the attendance center to meet the instructional standards of the state board.
- (3) Administer, supervise and evaluate the attendance center and make reports relating to the attendance center.
 - (4) Provide for the operation of the attendance center.
 - (5) Provide for the participation in community events and any planning or organization related thereto.
- (6) Supervise and coordinate intramural and inter-school sports plus other extracurricular activities.
 - (7) Coordinate and supervise parent-teacher organizations.
 - (8) Plan and implement parent-student-teacher conferences.
- (9) Prepare the budget of the attendance center and make any reports relating thereto.
- (10) Collect, manage and account for any activity fee imposed by the attendance center and make any reports relating thereto.
 - (11) Provide for routine maintenance of the attendance center.
 - (b) This section shall be effective on and after July 1, 2012.
- Sec. 12. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-7536 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-7536. (a) The purpose of this section is to allow any person desiring to obtain, analyze and compare financial and performance data of school districts the ability to do so.
- (b) On or before December 31, 2005, The state board of education shall design and implement a uniform system of reporting of such data by school districts. Such system shall be an internet-based data reporting system which is freely available and accessible. Such system shall allow a person to search and manipulate the data and allow for the comparison of data on a district by district basis. Such system may be designed so that school districts may input directly the district's financial and performance data in lieu of reporting data to the state board.
- (c) On or before December 31, 2011, the state board shall modify the system so that it includes detailed records of revenue and expenditure transactions of school districts that conform to the uniform chart of accounts prescribed by the state board under K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-8254, and amendments thereto. The state board shall require school districts to submit detailed revenue and expenditure records to the state board in an

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electronic format that is prescribed by the state board.

Sec. 13. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-8253 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8253. (a) Each school district shall compile and report expenditures of the district in providing programs required by law and the number of pupils enrolled in such programs. Such information shall be compiled and reported in the manner required by the department reported in accordance with the uniform chart of accounts prescribed by the state board under K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-8254, and amendments thereto.

- The department state board shall verify, on an on-going basis, expenditures of school districts in providing programs required by law and the number of pupils enrolled in such programs. Such verification may be conducted on a sample-basis of school districts.
- Sec. 14. K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-8254 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-8254. (a) In order to achieve uniform reporting of receipts and expenditures by school districts in school district budgets, districts shall report expenditures in the manner required by the state board and in reports submitted to the state board, the state board shall develop and maintain a uniform accounting and reporting system for the receipts and expenditures of school districts.
- (b) From and after July 1, 2012, the uniform accounting system developed by the state board shall be implemented and continually utilized by school districts and the state board of education.
- Sec. 15. K.S.A. 75-1124 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-1124. (a) A copy of each audit report with recommendations, if any, rendered by any licensed municipal public accountant or certified public accountant upon the completion of any audits provided for by K.S.A. 10-1208, 12-866, 13-1243, 13-14d12 or 75-1122, and any amendments to such statutes, shall be filed with the director of accounts and reports within one year after the end of the audit period of the audit unless an extension of time is granted by the director of accounts and reports. Final payment to any accountant performing a municipal audit shall not be made until a copy of such report has been so filed as shown by a statement of the director of accounts and reports.
- (b) The audit report prepared for a school district shall include a statement of assurance that the school district has reported the receipts and expenditures of the district in accordance with the uniform chart of accounts prescribed by the state board under K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-8254, and amendments thereto. A copy of such audit report also shall be filed with the state board of education.
- New Sec. 16. The legislature shall appropriate sufficient funds to pay 42 the costs incurred by the state board of education and school districts 43 which are attributable to the implementation of, and compliance with,

 - 2 Sec. 17. K.S.A. 75-1124 and K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-7536, 72-8253 and
- 3 72-8254 are hereby repealed.
- 4 Sec. 18. On and after July 1, 2012, K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 72-6441, 72-
- 5 6445a, 72-6451 and 72-6452 are hereby repealed.
- 6 Sec. 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
- 7 publication in the statute book.
