AN ACT concerning criminal procedure repealing K.S.A. 22-2501 1415 concerning criminal procedure; relating to search incident to ar-16 rest; amending K.S.A. 22-2501 and repealing the existing section; 17amending K.S.A. 22-2501 and repealing the existing section. 1819Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 22-2501 is hereby amended to read as follows: 22-20212501. When a lawful arrest is effected a law enforcement officer may reasonably search the person arrested and the area within such person's 22 23 immediate presence for the purpose of 24 (a) Protecting the officer from attack; 25 (b) Preventing the person from escaping; or 26(c) Discovering the fruits, instrumentalities, or evidence of a the 27 crime. 28Section 1. K.S.A. 22-2501 is hereby amended to read as fol-29 lows: 22-2501. When a lawful arrest is effected a law enforcement 30 officer may reasonably search the person arrested and the area within 31such person's immediate presence for the purpose of 32 (a) Protecting the officer from attack; 33 (b) Preventing the person from escaping; or 34 - (e) Discovering the fruits, instrumentalities, or evidence of a crime. 35 to the full extent allowed by and consistent with the constitution of the 36 United States. 37 [New Sec. 2. (a) On and after January 1, 2011, an optically 38 scanable "uniform citizen contact data form" shall be completed 39 and ready for use by all Kansas law enforcement officers to collect 40 data on each traffic or pedestrian stop. The uniform citizen contact 41data form shall replace the various traffic tickets used by the law 42enforcement agencies throughout the state of Kansas. The uniform 43 citizen contact data form shall be designed by the Kansas criminal

[(b) The data collected at each stop shall include: 6

[(1) Officer identification number;

8 [(2) law enforcement agency code;

9 [(3) month, day and year of stop;

[(4) hour and minute of stop; 10

[(5) who was stopped, a motorist or pedestrian; 11

12 [(6)] gender of person stopped, male or female;

13 [(7) specific age of person stopped;

race of person stopped, African-American, Hispanic, Na-14[(8) 15 tive American, caucasian, Asian, or other as stated by the person 16stopped or by officer observation;

17[(9) reason for stop: Violation of the criminal code; violation of 18a county resolution or city ordinance; calls for service; suspect or 19vehicle description or pre-existing knowledge or information, such 20as a warrant; citizens assist or welfare; or traffic violation such as 21a moving violation, equipment failure or license plate violation. If 22 a moving violation, the officer shall indicate the specific violation; 23

[(10) result of stop: Citation, warning or arrest;

24 [(11) if person was arrested, what crime or violation was 25alleged; 26

[(12) number of passengers in the vehicle;

27[(13) what was the nature of the search conducted on the pe-28destrian, driver or passenger, or of the vehicle or property or no 29 search was conducted;

30 [(14) search authority: By consent; tow inventory; odor of drugs or alcohol or both; plain view contraband; incidental to ar-3132 rest; dog alert; search warrant; or other;

33 [(15) was contraband discovered. If yes, was it illegal drugs; 34 drug paraphernalia; weapons; alcohol; currency or stolen property; or other: 35

36 [(16) stop location in agency boundaries, using the specific ad-37 dress of each stop including street address or highway mile 38 marker, city and county;

39 [(17) duration of stop listing the number of minutes; less than 5 minutes, 5-9 minutes, 10-19 minutes, 20-29 minutes, 30-39 40minutes, 40-49 minutes, 50-59 minutes or 60 or more minutes; 41

42[(18) vehicle license plate number; and

43 [(19) signature of law enforcement officer making the stop.

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1 [(c) Such uniform citizen contact data form shall be fully im-2 plemented and used by all Kansas law enforcement agencies by 3 January 1, 2011.

4 [(d) A copy of this completed form shall be given by the law 5 enforcement officer to the motorist or pedestrian who was 6 stopped.

7 [(e) Within 15 days after each stop, such forms shall be mailed, 8 faxed, optically scanned or sent electronically by each Kansas law 9 enforcement agency to the office of the department of vehicles 10 where such data shall be compiled into a statewide citizen contact 11 database.

12 [(f) The Kansas attorney general shall monthly compile data
13 received from law enforcement agencies and make such data avail14 able to the public and all law enforcement agencies.

15 [(g) The data will be analyzed by statistical experts for patterns 16 of racial profiling at least once every three months. The results of 17 each three-month analysis shall be posted on the official website 18 of the attorney general starting with the data collected from Jan-19 uary 1, 2011 through March 31, 2011.

[(h) Law enforcement agencies or individual officers who need to correct such agency's or individual's racially biased behavior shall be contacted by the attorney general's office within two weeks after a pattern of racial discrimination is identified as one standard deviation above the mean for all races of motorists and pedestrians stopped in a five block radius in a town or city or a 10 mile section of road or highway.

[(i) An annual report summarizing the types of citizen contacts and which law enforcement agencies need to end their racially biased policing shall be prepared by the attorney general and submitted to the legislature, governor and Kansas law enforcement agencies on or before January 31 of each year. Each annual report shall be posted on the official website of the attorney general.

[(j) The department of transportation shall be responsible for
 implementing the provisions of this section.]
