## SENATE BILL No. 525

By Committee on Public Health and Welfare

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9 AN ACT concerning the fair hospital charges act.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. Sections 1 through 5, and amendments thereto, shall be known and may be cited as the fair hospital charges act.

- Sec. 2. As used in sections 1 through 5, and amendments thereto:
- (a) "Act" means the fair hospital charges act.
- (b) "Eligible self-pay patient" means any self-pay patient whose household income is equal to or less than 300% of the federal poverty guidelines and who is not eligible for or enrolled in an employer-sponsored group health insurance plan.
- (c) "Health care goods" includes all goods supplied to a patient in connection with any health care services for which compensation is or may be charged to such patient.
- (d) "Health care services" means any medically necessary act of diagnosis, treatment or care provided to a patient for which compensation is or may be charged to such patient.
- (e) "Hospital" means any medical care facility defined in K.S.A. 65-425, and amendments thereto, and is a not-for-profit organization that is exempt from federal income taxation pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended.
- (f) "Self-pay patient" means any patient who receives health care goods or services for which insurance or government benefits are unavailable or insufficient.
- Sec. 3. (a) No hospital shall seek to collect an amount for health care goods or health care services supplied to an eligible self-pay patient that exceeds the amount the individual hospital's highest volume private payer would pay for the same goods and services by more than 25%.
- (b) Any invoice or other statement issued to a patient shall prominently disclose the amount the individual hospital's highest volume private payer would pay for the same goods and services listed thereon.
- (c) Any invoice or other statement issued to a patient shall prominently contain the following notice:
- "Notice to eligible self-pay patients: If you can demonstrate that your household income is equal to or less than 300% of current federal poverty

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guidelines, you may not be required to pay more than 125% of the insurance reimbursement amount for subject goods and services. Please contact hospital representative for details."

- Sec. 4. Any hospital shall adopt reasonable procedures for explaining the limitations of this act to its patients and confirming whether any patient who claims to be an eligible self-pay patient meets the standard. No hospital shall commence collection activities against any patient without first making a reasonable, good faith inquiry to determine whether the patient is an eligible self-pay patient.
- Sec. 5. Any violation of this act by a hospital shall be deemed an unconscionable act and practice within the meaning of K.S.A. 50-627, and amendments thereto, and subject to the penalties authorized under the Kansas consumer protection act, K.S.A. 50-623 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- 15 Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
