## **SENATE RESOLUTION No. 1812**

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9 A RESOLUTION urging parents to become more actively involved in 10 their children's education and urging the State Board of Education to develop strategies to be used to develop active parental involvement 11 12in the education of their children. 13 WHEREAS, There is consistent, positive and convincing evidence that 1415 families have a major influence on their children's achievement in school; 16and 17WHEREAS, It has been found in the publication "A New Wave of 18Evidence: The Impact of School, Family, and Community Connections on Student Achievement" that students with involved parents are more 1920likely to succeed in school because those students attend school regularly, 21earn higher grades and are more likely to continue on to the postsecon-22 dary educational level; and 23 WHEREAS, Schools attended by students with involved parents are more successful than schools attended by students whose parents are not 24 25involved; and 26 WHEREAS, Congress has found that research studies consistently 27show a positive relationship between parental involvement and student 28achievement regardless of the economic, racial, ethnic, educational back-29 ground or ages of the student; and 30 WHEREAS, Parents are the first and most important educators of their 31 children: and 32 WHEREAS, Parents and teachers should work together in an equal 33 partnership that is both positive and cooperative; and 34 WHEREAS, Teachers and parents, in support of each other, form the 35 future citizens of the world; and 36 WHEREAS, Parents who participate in their children's education and 37 formation, at school and at home, not only exemplify parenting skills, but 38 also serve as a model of community stewardship and public service lead-39 ership; and 40 WHEREAS, Through active parental involvement, parents who support their children's education directly by developing personally, com-4142municating effectively, contributing authentically and education collabor-43 atively; and

1 WHEREAS, Effective communication is established through respect-

2 ful, constructive and on-going contact: Now, therefore,

3 *Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas:* That Parents col-4 laborate with teachers in the education of their children by knowing the 5 curricular standards, establishing and sharing expectations and goals with

5 curricular standards, establishing and sharing expectations and goals with 6 both their children and their children's teachers, supervising their chil-

7 dren's academic progress, attending parent-teacher conferences and 8 maintaining weekly contact with their children's teachers; and

9 Be it further resolved: That Parents are encouraged to attend all man-

datory classroom parent meetings, become a room parent, provide coach ing to school teams, become recess monitors, assist with student clubs,

help coordinate school fund-raising activities and offer other volunteerservice at school; and

14 Be it further resolved: That Parents are encouraged to demonstrate 15 regular involvement in the school building, at school functions and on 16 decision-making school committees through participation in Parent 17 Teacher Associations (PTA) and other school organizations such as Home 18 and School, School Board meetings and Partners in Education; and

Be it further resolved: That the State Board of Education is urged to
develop strategies to be used to develop active parental involvement in
the education of their children; and
