HB 2065, An act repealing K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-15,127; concerning inheritance or succession tax, by Committee on Taxation.

HB 2066, An act concerning property taxation; relating to school district ad valorem tax levy and exemption therefrom; amending K.S.A. 72-6431 and K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 79-201x and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Taxation.

HB 2067, An act concerning persons with disabilities; establishing the statewide independent living council of Kansas; membership; powers and duties; relating to funding of such council, by Committee on Appropriations.

HB 2068, An act concerning certain municipalities; relating to the Kansas tort claims act; amending K.S.A. 2002 Supp. 75-6102 and 75-6104 and repealing the existing sections, by Representatives Sloan, Boyer, Holland and Toelkes.
