**HB 2529**, An act concerning certain business entities; relating to franchise fees; collection and administration of franchise tax by secretary of revenue; amending K.S.A. 17-1513, 17-1618, 17-7510, 17-7511, 17-7512 and 56-1a608 and K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 17-2036, 17-2718, 17-4634, 17-4677, 17-7503, 17-7504, 17-7505, 17-7507, 17-7509, 17-76,125, 17-76,139, 45-221, 56-1a606, 56-1a607, 56a-1201, 56a-1202 and 56a-1203 and repealing the existing sections; also repealing K.S.A. 2003 Supp. 17-7508, by Special Committee on Assessment and Taxation.
