#### INTRODUCTION OF ORIGINAL MOTIONS AND HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

The following resolution was introduced and read by title:

HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 6026-

By Committee on Utilities

A RESOLUTION requesting the State Corporation Commission to take certain actions and make certain determinations regarding deployment of high speed Internet service in the state of Kansas.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas: That the State Corporation Commission ("KCC"): (a) Is requested to require each incumbent local exchange carrier ("ILEC") and any subsidiaries to provide the KCC with accurate maps and such other information required by the KCC to determine those areas of the state where ILEC's and their subsidiaries provide, or will provide by January 1, 2006, Internet service with both upstream transmission, from customer to provider, and downstream transmission, from provider to customer, of at least 512 kilobits per second ("high speed Internet service"); (b) is requested to require that such information include the technology or technologies (i.e., DSL, cable, wireless) used to provide high speed Internet service; and (c) may maintain the confidentiality of such maps and information at the request of the ILEC or subsidiary, except to the extent necessary for the KCC to respond to the requests made in this resolution; and

Be it further resolved: That the KCC is requested to determine by September 1, 2004, those areas of the state, other than those determined by the KCC under (a) above, where high speed Internet service is provided, or will be provided by January 1, 2006, by providers other than ILEC's and their subsidiaries; and

Be it further resolved: That the KCC is requested to develop and issue, not later than October 10, 2004, a request for information to identify responsible high speed Internet service providers willing to provide access to such service for consumers in the areas of the state other than those areas where the KCC determines there will be service by January 1, 2006 and, not later than December 1, 2004: (a) Identify the least expensive technological option offered by a responsible provider for each unserved part of the state, as determined by the KCC; and (b) determine what, if any, subsidy from the Kansas Universal Service Fund ("KUSF") would be necessary for deployment of high speed Internet service in such unserved areas; and

Be it further resolved: That the KCC is requested to submit to the Legislature, on or before January 10, 2005, a report which includes: (a) The estimated cost to the KUSF to support deployment of high speed Internet service in such unserved areas by January 1, 2007, not to include support of ongoing operation of such service; (b) a recommendation concerning the technology appropriate to provide high speed Internet service to each unserved area; (c) a recommendation of policy and funding requirements necessary to ensure that ubiquitous high speed Internet service is available and that competition exists ubiquitously; and

Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives provide an enrolled copy of this resolution to each member of the State Corporation Commission.
