THIRTEENTH DAY

SENATE CHAMBER, TOPEKA, KANSAS Thursday, January 29, 2004—2:30 p.m.

The Senate was called to order by President Dave Kerr. The roll was called with thirty-eight senators present. Senators Corbin and Goodwin were excused. Invocation by Chaplain Fred S. Hollomon:
