On motion of Senator Huelskamp, the Senate acceded to the request of the House for a conference on **HB 2118**.

On motion of Senator Emler, the Senate acceded to the request of the House for a conference on **HB 2592**.

The President appointed Senators Emler, Apple and Lee as conferees on the part of the Senate.

An objection having been made to **HB 2705**, **HB 2758**, **HB 2951** appearing on the Consent Calendar, the President directed the bills be removed and placed on the calendar under the heading of General Orders.

REPORT ON ENGROSSED BILLS

Sub SB 322 reported correctly engrossed March 10, 2006.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Committee on **Commerce** recommends **HB 2856** be amended on page 1, after line 42, by inserting the following:

"Sec. 2. K.S.A. 46-1601 is hereby amended to read as follows: 46-1601. (a) The purpose of the legislative committees shall be to:

(1) (*a*) Facilitate the growth, diversification and expansion of existing enterprises and the creation by Kansans of new wealth-generating enterprises;

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(2) (b) promote economic diversification and innovation within the basic industries and sectors of the state;

(3) (c) promote increased productivity and value added products, processes and services among wealth-generating enterprises, and the export of those goods and services created by small and large Kansas enterprises to the nation and world;

(4) (d) maintain and revitalize economically depressed rural areas and urban neighborhoods by annually targeting scarce resources by size, sector and location to communities and enterprises of particular need and opportunity, and by working in close collaboration with local communities; and

(5) (e) protect and enhance the environmental quality of the state in ways consistent with dynamic economic growth; and

(f) promote and evaluate workforce development to meet the needs of the economy."; And by renumbering the remaining sections accordingly;

Also on page 1, in line 43, after "K.S.A." by inserting "46-1601 and K.S.A."; also in line 43, by striking "is" and inserting "are";

In the title, in line 9, by striking "the department of commerce" and inserting "economic development"; in line 10, after the semicolon, by inserting "legislative economic develop-ment committees;"; also in line 10, after "K.S.A." by inserting "46-1601 and K.S.A."; in line 11, by striking "section" and inserting "sections"; and the bill be passed as amended.

Committee on Federal and State Affairs recommends HB 2595 be passed.

Committee on Judiciary recommends HB 2663 be passed.

Also, HB 2554, as amended by House Committee, be amended on page 3, in line 26, after "investigation" by inserting "database"; by striking all in lines 27 through 34;

On page 4, in line 39, by striking the first "the" and inserting ": (A) The"; in line 40, by striking the comma and inserting "and"; also in line 40, by striking "and expungement";

On page 5, in line 1, by striking "and" and inserting a semicolon; in line 2, before "other" by inserting the following:

"(B) a procedure which allows the defendant to request the DNA samples be expunged and destroyed in the event of a dismissal of charges or acquittal at trial; and

Also on page 5, in line 19, after the stricken "(l)" by inserting "In the event that a person's DNA sample is lost or is not adequate for any reason, the person shall provide another sample for analysis."; and the bill be passed as amended.

Committee on Natural Resources recommends HB 2875, as amended by House Committee, be amended by substituting a new bill to be designated as "SENATE Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2875," as follows:

"SENATE Substitute for HOUSE BILL NO. 2875

By Committee on Natural Resources

"AN ACT concerning sand and gravel pits; relating to the beneficial use of water; amending K.S.A. 2005 Supp. 82a-734 and repealing the existing section.";

and the substitute bill be passed.
