## INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

The following bills were introduced and read by title:

**SB 367**, An act concerning the Kansas commission on veterans affairs; pertaining to the membership thereof; pertaining to the executive director thereof; amending K.S.A. 73-1208a and 73-1208c and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Federal and State Affairs.

**SB 368**, An act concerning professional corporations; relating to audiologists; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 17-2707 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Ways and Means.

**SB 369**, An act concerning the infrastructure needs of state educational institutions and the financing thereof; enacting the university infrastructure finance law; enacting the state board of regents infrastructure maintenance finance loan program law; relating to the powers and duties of the state board of regents, the Kansas turnpike authority and the Kansas development finance authority; amending K.S.A. 68-2011 and K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-4209 and 75-4237 and repealing the existing sections, by Committee on Ways and Means.

**CONSIDERATION OF MOTIONS TO CONCUR OR NONCONCUR**

On motion of Senator Brownlee the Senate nonconcurred in the House amendments to **SB 83** and requested a conference committee be appointed.

The President appointed Senators Brownlee, Jordan and Barone as a conference committee on the part of the Senate.

**REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES**

Committee on **Agriculture** recommends **HB 2013** be passed and, because the committee is of the opinion that the bill is of a noncontroversial nature, be placed on the consent calendar.

Committee on **Elections and Local Government** recommends **HB 2021** be passed and, because the committee is of the opinion that the bill is of a noncontroversial nature, be placed on the consent calendar.

Committee on **Federal and State Affairs** recommends **SB 319** be amended on page 1, in line 14, after "any" by inserting "unoccupied, residential"; in line 26, after "estate" by inserting ", including lienholders of record,"; in line 30, by striking "an action seeking hearing" and inserting "a cause of action"; On page 2, in line 10, after "estate" by inserting ", including lienholders of record,"; in line 14, by striking "an action seeking hearing" and inserting "a cause of action"; in line 43, after the first comma by inserting "or both,";

On page 3, in line 42, after the quotation mark by inserting ", or both,"; in line 43, by striking "and" and inserting "or";

On page 4, in line 1, after "sessments" by inserting ", or both,"; and the bill be passed as amended.
