SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 438

As Amended by House Committee of the Whole

Brief*

SB 438 would adjust current fees within the Kansas Department of Agriculture. The bill would require that the existing fees being increased by the bill would return to current levels on July 1, 2005.

The following outlines the fees being increased by SB 438.

The bill would make amendments to the Kansas Meat and Poultry Inspection Act to add definitions for the terms "wholesaler," "distributor," and "public warehouseman." Individuals engaged in these activities would have to have a license. People engaging in the sale of meat and poultry products for youth fund raising activities would have to register.

The law dealing with dairy products would be amended to eliminate the agency's responsibility with respect to licensure of counter freezers and homemade ice cream manufacturing. The following fees would be eliminated.

Also, the bill would create the Fertilizer and Pesticide Compliance and Administration Fund, where an amount equal to \$.05 per ton of fertilizer sold would be deposited.

Finally, the bill would require the Department of Agriculture to reimburse the fee for a water rights application to the applicant if the application is not processed within 150 days of receipt by the agency of the complete application.

Background

This bill was introduced at the request of the Secretary of Agriculture as one of the package of four bills designed to address financial needs within the Department of Agriculture. The bill was referred separately to the Senate Agriculture Committee and Senate Ways and Means Committee.

Several days of hearings were held on this bill. The Secretary of Agriculture appeared in support of the bill and indicated that the bill was necessary to carry out existing statutory programmatic requirements. A spokesperson representing the Kansas Farm Bureau appeared in qualified support of the package of fee bills brought forth by the Secretary of Agriculture. Those appearing in opposition to all or parts of the bill included representatives of the Kansas Cooperative Council, the Kansas Propane Marketers, the Kansas Seed Industry Association, Northwest Kansas Groundwater Management District #4, the Petroleum Marketers and Convenience Store Association of Kansas, Mid-America

Lumbermen's Association, the Kansas Grain and Feed Association, and the Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association. Concern was expressed about certain provisions of the bill in written testimony submitted by the Kansas Food Dealers Association.

The Senate Committee on Agriculture amended the bill to provide that as of July 1, 2005, the new fees would cease and existing fees would return to current levels. In addition, the Committee amended the bill to eliminate the new fee proposed for an application to change ownership of a water right; to make the change in the application fee for multiple changes to a water right in amounts "not to exceed" the amount provided in the bill; to establish a schedule of fees based on quantity for annual water use reports; to clarify the new fees imposed on metering devices are not to apply to dispensing devices as defined by KSA 83-401a; to lower the fees imposed on facilities with large scales; and to establish a "facility fee cap (any combination of measuring devices) at \$120 per facility.

The House Committee on Appropriations amended the bill by striking all new fees contained in the bill. These include the annual inspection fees for animal facilities where the agency has reviewed and approved nutrient utilization plans, annual facility authorization fees for scales, and annual water rights administration fees. The Committee further amended the bill to require the Department of Agriculture to reimburse the water rights application fee if the application is not processed within 150 days of receipt by the agency of the complete application.

The House Committee of the Whole amended the bill by striking all fee increases pertaining to the meat and poultry inspection program.
