# SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1614

### As Amended by House Committee on Appropriations

#### Brief\*

SCR 1614, as amended, urges the Secretary of Aging and the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS) to begin an education and awareness campaign encouraging younger Kansans to invest in long-term care insurance at an age when it is affordable. The resolution also encourages the Secretary of SRS to aggressively pursue a five-year look back period for capturing disqualifying transfers for Medicaid eligibility and report back to the 2003 Legislature

## **Background**

The Secretary of Aging spoke in support of the resolution. There were no opponents to the resolution. The original resolution did not include SRS, or recommend the pursuit of a five-year look back period.

The Budget Division indicates there is no fiscal impact to this resolution.
