# SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2867

# As Recommended by House Committee on Judiciary

### Brief\*

HB 2867 repeals two statutes that have prohibited certain aliens, who are ineligible for citizenship, from inheriting and transferring property.

The bill also contains technical amendments regarding child-inneed-of-care records.

#### Background

The legislative sponsor appeared in favor of the bill. A letter of support was received from a law professor with the Alien Land Law Project.

The fiscal note indicates that there may be an increase in postage expenses for correspondence with individuals regarding the probate process. The amount of increase cannot be estimated at this time. Other monetary amounts which could lead to a savings regarding childin-need-of-care records cannot be estimated at this time. The Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services and the Juvenile Justice Authority indicate there would be no fiscal effect on their agencies.
