CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT BRIEF SENATE BILL NO. 112

As Agreed to April 2, 2007

Brief*

SB 112 would grant Johnson County additional local sales tax authority of 0.25 percent to finance the construction costs of certain public safety projects. Any such tax imposed would be required to sunset in 10 years or less but could be extended for additional periods of 10 years or less. Voter approval would be required prior to the imposition or extension of any such tax, and the county would be required to share the money with cities based on the current statutory distribution formula unique to Johnson County.

Conference Committee Action

The original SB 112 dealt with examination reporting requirements for insurance companies. The Conference Committee removed the bill's original language and inserted the Johnson County public safety sales tax provisions. These latter provisions had previously passed the Senate in Senate Sub. for HB 2264 and Sub. for SB 375.

Background

The bill would not be expected to have any fiscal impact for the state.
