SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2042

As Amended by Senate Committee of the Whole

Brief*

Sub. for HB 2042, as amended, would:

- Permit licensees whose driver's license expires on their twenty-first birthday, to have 45 days from the date of expiration of the license to renew their license;
- Provide that the license would be valid for the 45 days or until it is renewed, whichever is sooner;
- Provide that the licensee who renews the license would not be required to take a driving test pursuant to existing law; and
- Provide that any county treasurer authorized to accept applications for driver's license or administer driver's license examinations be deemed to be acting as an agent of the State of Kansas.

Background

HB 2042, as introduced, would have required all drivers' licenses to be renewed on a person's twenty-first birthday. The substitute bill, as explained in the brief, was the product of deliberations of a House Transportation subcommittee and approved by the House Transportation Committee.

The Senate Committee of the Whole amendment would provide that any county treasurer authorized to accept applications for driver's license or administration of driver's license examinations be deemed to be acting as an agent of the state.

The fiscal note on the original substitute bill states that passage of the bill would not significantly impact state highway revenues.
