SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2096

As Recommended by House Committee on Health and Human Services

Brief*

HB 2096 would amend laws governing the meetings and elections of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy by removing the requirement that the annual meeting to elect officers be held in June. The bill also would remove a requirement that the Board meet, at least once per year, for the purpose of examining applicants for licensure as pharmacists.

Background

HB 2096 was introduced by the House Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy. The Executive Secretary of the Board noted that the Board is not opposed to having annual meetings, but would like to hold elections after new board members have been appointed. Additionally, the Board representative noted that both examinations for applicants are given nationally and the Board no longer examines or interviews applicants for licensure.

The fiscal note prepared by the Division of the Budget indicates that passage of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the operations of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy.
