Corrected SESSION OF 2008

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON SENATE BILL NO. 363

As Amended by House Committee on Economic Development and Tourism

Brief*

SB 363 would increase the Rural Housing Incentive Act population limits as follows:

- Cities with a population less than 40,000 (current law) to 60,000 in a county with a population less than 60,000 (current law) to 80,000; and
- Counties with a population less than 40,000 (current law) to 60,000.

Background

The Rural Housing Incentive Act establishes the means by which the governing bodies of certain cities and counties can acquire and dispose of property, and can procure and use funding to encourage the development and renovation of housing within communities.

Representative Charlie Roth and the President/CEO of the Salina Area Chamber of Commerce appeared as proponents for the bill.

The House Committee amended the bill to update a statutory reference.

The fiscal note indicates that enactment of the bill would have no fiscal effect on the state budget.
