SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2663

As Amended by House Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security

Brief*

HB 2663, as amended, would prohibit a veterans service representative of the Kansas Commission on Veterans Affairs (KCVA) from taking power of attorney in the name of the KCVA when assisting a veteran with a claim.

Background

In 2006, the Legislature enacted House Sub. for SB 396, which directed the Kansas Commission on Veterans' Affairs to establish and administer a program to help veterans with claims for assistance through annual grant agreements with veterans service organizations. Attorney General Opinion No. 2007-20 said current law allows representatives of both the veterans service organizations and the KCVA to take power of attorney when representing veterans in claims.

Representative Ruff, who requested and testified as a proponent of the bill, said HB 2663 is intended to clarify legislative intent of the 2006 bill. Representatives of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and The American Legion, the veterans service organizations that currently receive grants from the KCVA, also testified in favor of the bill. The executive director of the KCVA testified in opposition to the bill.

The House Veterans, Military, and Homeland Security Committee amended the bill to simplify the bill's language.
