SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2207

As Recommended by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

Brief*

HB 2207 would amend the current law to increase the maximum amount that could be assessed for supervision fees against an individual who is charged with a crime and released on supervision under the conditions of an appearance bond. The amount would change from \$10 per week to \$15 per week for supervision fees.

Background

The proponents that testified in the House Committee were Hon. Stephen Tatum, Chief Judge of the 10th Judicial District Court (Johnson County), and Risë Haneberg, Johnson County Criminal Justice Coordinator.

There were no opponents that testified in the House Committee.

In the fiscal note, the Office of Judicial Administration states that enactment of HB 2207 would have a negligible fiscal effect on court operations.
