SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2411

As Amended by House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice

Brief*

HB 2411 would amend the Kansas Uniform Controlled Substances Act to expand the list of Schedule I controlled substances to include the chemical compounds HU-210, JWH-018, JWH-073, BZP, and TFMPP.

The bill would become effective upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.

Background

The proponents of the bill, as introduced, who testified in the House Committee hearing were representatives of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association, the Kansas Association of Chiefs of Police, the Kansas Sheriffs Association, the Kansas Peace Officers Association, and the Kansas Board of Pharmacy.

The opponents of the bill, as introduced, who testified in the House Committee hearing were an attorney for a business and several private citizens.

The House Committee amended the bill to include BZP and TFMPP in the list of Schedule I controlled substances. These are the chemical compounds that are in HB 2451. HB 2451 had a hearing in the House Committee on Corrections and Juvenile Justice. The proponents were the same but there were no opponents that testified. The Committee also amended the bill to make the effective date upon publication in the *Kansas Register*.
