SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2468

As Amended by Senate Committee on Judiciary

Brief*

HB 2468, as amended, would amend the Kansas Offender Registration Act to require a person convicted of any attempt, conspiracy, or criminal solicitation of certain sex crimes to register for life. The sex crimes that would require lifetime registration would be the attempt, conspiracy, or criminal solicitation to commit aggravated trafficking, rape, aggravated indecent liberties with a child, aggravated criminal sodomy, promoting prostitution if the prostitute is less than 14 years of age, and sexual exploitation of a child.

Background

Currently, a person who has been convicted of attempt, conspiracy, or criminal solicitation of certain sex crimes must register pursuant to the Kansas Offender Registry Act for ten years. HB 2468 would increase the time a person would be required to register for those crimes from ten years to life.

The proponent of the bill, as introduced, who testified in the House Committee was a representative of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association and the Eighteenth Judicial District (Sedgwick).

There were no opponents of the bill who testified in the House Committee.

The proponent of the bill who testified in the Senate Committee was a representative of the Kansas County and District Attorneys' Association and the Eighteenth Judicial District (Sedgwick).

There were no opponents of the bill who testified in the Senate Committee.

The Senate Committee made technical amendments to the bill at the request of the revisor assigned to the Committee.

According to the fiscal note on the bill, as introduced, the Kansas Bureau of Investigation the passage of HB 2468 would increase the number of active records in the Kansas Offender Registry, which would increase the agency's staff time to maintain the Registry. The agency estimates it would need 1.0 additional Administrative Assistant FTE position in FY 2011 at an ongoing cost of \$37,340 from the State General Fund. Any fiscal effect associated with HB 2468 is not reflected in *The FY 2011 Governor's Budget Report*.
