1 AN ACT designating part of K-99 as the Frankfurt Boys World War II
2 highway; amending K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 68-1057 and repealing the
3 existing section.

5 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

6 New Section 1. The portion of highway K-99 from the south city
7 limits of Frankfurt, north on K-99 highway to the junction with United
8 States highway 36 is hereby designated as the Frankfurt Boys World War
9 II highway. The secretary of transportation shall place signs along the
10 highway right-of-way at proper intervals to indicate that the highway is
11 the Frankfurt Boys World War II highway, except that such signs shall not
12 be placed until the secretary has received sufficient moneys from gifts
13 and donations to reimburse the secretary for the cost of placing such signs
14 and an additional 50% of the cost to defray future maintenance or
15 replacement costs of such signs. The secretary of transportation may
16 accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in obtaining and
17 installing suitable signs.

18 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 68-1057 is hereby amended to read as
19 follows: 68-1057. From the ~~junction of United States highway 36 with K-~~
20 ~~99~~ *south city limits of Frankfurt*, south on K-99 highway to the junction of
21 K-99 and interstate highway 70, is hereby designated as "The Road to
22 Oz." The secretary of transportation shall place signs along the highway
23 right-of-way at proper intervals to indicate that the highway is "The Road
24 to Oz," except that such signs shall not be placed until the secretary has
25 received sufficient moneys from gifts and donations to reimburse the
26 secretary for the cost of placing such signs. The secretary of
27 transportation may accept and administer gifts and donations to aid in
28 obtaining and installing suitable signs.

29 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 68-1057 is hereby repealed.

30 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its
31 publication in the statute book.
