AN ACT concerning the legislature; relating to legislative documents; establishing the Kansas legislature paper-free task force; specifying members and powers and duties, thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the Kansas legislature paper-free task force which shall study and determine whether the Kansas legislature should adopt a paperless initiative in order to reduce the number of printed calendars, journals, bills, resolutions, reports and other legislative paperwork distributed to its legislative members, legislative staff and to members of the public. In making such determination, the Kansas legislature paper-free task force shall consider the following:

- (1) The need to make such documents easily available to legislative members and staff, members of the public, state libraries and other interested parties;
- (2) the need to protect the authenticity of and to preserve such documents;
 - (3) the cost of distributing such documents electronically; and
- (4) compliance by the Kansas legislature with the open meetings act as provided in K.S.A. 75-4317 et seq., and amendments thereto, and the open records act as provided in K.S.A. 45-215 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (b) (1) The Kansas legislature paper-free task force shall be composed of 16 members as follows:
- (A) One member who is the chairperson of the joint committee on information technology;
- (B) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the president of the senate;
- (C) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the vice president of the senate;
- (D) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the majority leader of the senate;
- (E) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the minority leader of the senate;
- (F) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;

 (G) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the speaker pro tem of the house of representatives;

- (H) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the majority leader of the house of representatives;
- (I) one member who is a member of the legislature appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives;
 - (J) the secretary of the senate or the secretary's designee;
- (K) the chief clerk of the house of representatives or the chief clerk's designee;
 - (L) the revisor of statutes or the revisor's designee;
 - (M) the director of legislative research or the director's designee;
- (N) the director of legislative administrative services or the director's designee;
 - (O) the state librarian or the state librarian's designee; and
- (P) the legislative chief information technology officer or the legislative chief information technology officer's designee.
- (2) The secretary of the senate, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, the revisor of statutes, the director of legislative research, the director of legislative administrative services, the state librarian and the legislative chief information technology officer shall be non-voting, ex officio members of the Kansas legislature paper-free task force.
- (c) Appointments shall be made no later than August 1, 2014. All vacancies in the membership of the committee shall be filled in the same manner as originally filled.
- (d) The initial meeting of the Kansas legislature paper-free task force shall be convened no later than September 1, 2014. The chairperson of the joint committee on information technology shall be the chairperson of the Kansas legislature paper-free task force.
- (e) The Kansas legislature paper-free task force may meet at any time on the call of the chairperson. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. All actions of the council shall be by motion adopted by a majority of those voting members present when there is a quorum.
- (f) The staff of the office of revisor of statutes, the legislative research department and the division of legislative administrative services shall provide such assistance as may be requested by the Kansas legislature paper-free task force and to the extent authorized by the legislative coordinating council.
- (g) The legislative members of the Kansas legislature paper-free task force shall be paid compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage and other expenses as provided by K.S.A. 75-3223, and amendments thereto.
- (h) On or before the first day of the 2016 regular session of the legislature, the Kansas legislature paper-free task force shall submit a written report on its findings and recommendations to the legislature,

- 1 including, but not limited to, any recommendations for legislation.
