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


## Comparisons with State and National Rates








# Suicide Rates per 100,000 by Age

## Sedgwick County Suicide Prevention Efforts

#### Mental Health First Aid

- 104 people trained in MHFA in 2020
- Went virtual for the first time, allowed for expanded access
- 80 trained through Aug 2021, 7 more classes scheduled

#### • Zero Suicide implementation

- Expanding screening, data tracking, and care collaboration
- Building community awareness/leadership, enhancing continuous quality improvement
- Trainings in evidence-based screening, assessment, and interventions, including QPR, CALM, AMSR, and CAMS

#### • 988 expansion efforts underway

- Expected to go live in July 2022
- Crisis call volume expected to increase
- COMCARE will support 988 calls from the Sedgwick County area





## Challenges and Opportunities

- Workforce Shortages
  - Training, recruitment, retention of mental health professionals
  - Supporting primary care clinicians in treatment of mental illness
    - KSKidsMAP
- Grassroots efforts, education, promoting help-seeking
  - Zero Reasons Why
  - Suspenders 4 Hope
- Infrastructure and funding
  - CCBHC
