History of the SIA Program

As part of lifting the Moratorium plan at Osawatomie State Hospital (OSH), KDADS developed a new provider type, State Institutional Alternative (SIA).

SIA providers expand the number of regional psychiatric hospital beds to serve individuals with mental illness meeting the criteria for state hospital admission.

SIAs provide regional alternatives to Larned State Hospital (LSH) and OSH, allowing for care closer to home for patients and reducing demand on the state hospitals, as well as reducing wait times for admissions.

SIA providers can bill Medicaid for those patients with KanCare coverage and KDADS provides funding for uninsured patients through HealthSource Integrated Solutions.

Using the SIA providers has led to revisions to the standard screening form, standardization of medical clearance information needed for admission, and improved reporting through a central bed board to show inpatient space availability across state hospitals and community hospitals with inpatient psychiatric capacity.





*KDADS has reached a contract agreement with KVC Hospitals (KVC) to open a modern acute psychiatric hospital in Hays to meet the needs of youth in western Kansas. The contract, effective July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2027, specifies admissions will begin in 2023 at a licensed 14-bed treatment center for youth up to 18 years to include up to 10 no-eject no-reject State Institutional Alternative (SIA) beds focused on patients from the Larned State Hospital (LSH) catchment area.
