### WHAT ARE THE OUTCOMES?

### LIVES ARE FOREVER CHANGED FOR BOTH OUR FAMILIES EXPERIENCING POVERTY AND OUR MIDDLE CLASS FRIENDS.

This is a process, but it is working. We have multiple Core families who have journeyed completely out of poverty.

- · Families articulating they no longer live under the toxic stress of poverty

### WHAT DOES IT **LOOK LIKE**

Core Community is a weekly evening program.

We start each week serving a family-style meal to our families and volunteers.

### 6:15 P.M.

Our families' children go to childcare where they experience fun activities with caring adult volunteers.

### 6:15 P.M.

Our adult participants join together to share their lives and grow together through various curriculums and programming.

### The Core Community Process



### **ENGAGING**

Phase 1 is a 20 week class called "Getting Ahead in a Just-Gettin'-By World."



### CONNECTING

Phase 2 is connecting families with middle class community members.



### RELATIONAL

Families are with us 2-5 years. We're solving poverty through loving relationships.

Often, people do not spend time in social settings with people who are not like them. We know that if that does not change, then nothing changes. Core Community is about bringing families experiencing poverty to a safe place where their voices are heard. They are treated with honor and dignity as they begin to

# THERE'S A PLACE FOR YOU

# **WE BELIEVE:**

That working together can make a difference. That trauma and poverty are community issues that we can no longer ignore.

## **HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?**

### **CORE LEADERS**

Core Leaders are brave families experiencing poverty who join us to lead the community in healing this complex and sensitive issue. The first step is a 20 week commitment.

### **CORE FRIENDS**


Core Friends are middle and upper income people who commit one night a month for 18 months befriending someone who is working their way out of poverty.

### **CORE VOLUNTEERS**

- Meals: Groups (Church, City Council, Hospital) willing to prepare & serve a meal one or two times a year or once a quarter.
- Childcare helpers who occasionally or weekly come to play with children as their parents work on their goals and the program.
- Financial support to pay for the minimal staff who work to make the project happen each week.
- A sponsoring location who will adopt us as a part of their mission & host our weekly program.



It takes 2 to 5 years on average for an individual or family to walk out of poverty in a project like this. We define leaving poverty as 200% above the federal poverty guideline as stated in the year that success is achieved.

458 graduates and 18 non-grads have data. We have solid data on 91% overall. 343 increased income, 54 decreased income, and 61 had no change. We estimate 79% of all participants have sabilized their lives.



# **Target**




