Johnson County Mobility Collaborative



Combining their expertise UHC and JCMHC created a mobility project that provided employment support for UHC behavioral health members.



Project provided transportation to employment for members without access to public transportation, person or family mobility options.



Effort now has effected 8+ direct employment (full or part time) for UHC behavioral health members as Peer Mobility Specialists.





Education

Adults over age 19 can get help with education advancement. Includes: GED, Coding Classes, English as a second language, Resume Writing Workshops. Health plan will pay up to \$200 annually for education.

- -Post-training, the students test to earn their credentials as a medical coder

Fundamental of Medical Coding Program

- A 6-week program that began January 17, 2023.
- The training offers detailed fundamentals that can be used on the job as well as expand their reach in their career path.
- After the program, the student will be awarded a certificate of completion that can be used to present to their employer or add to their resume.
- This program will enhance their understanding of Medical Coding in Healthcare.
- All inclusive program:
 - Acceptance of individuals with various backgrounds
 - The student is not required to have a GED or Diploma
 - Low financial risk to participants
 - Remove barriers to financial independence for participants.
 - Also, providing professional job-readiness and follow up and assistance with job placement when warranted
 - Ongoing mentorship (professional and life skills)

8 completed the program

13 students are midway of completion



Julie, a success story.

- Julie began her career when she completed an insurance coding and billing program at Concord in 2008 and became a member educator with employees under her.
- Life took a turn when her husband died of cancer, and her daughter began having anxiety attacks. She didn't take a family leave of absence and was later fired. This spiral of life issues was the root of her going homeless.
- Julie started the program, The Fundamentals of Medical Coding in April 2023,to get back in the swing of life, however, family challenges hit again, also having to find a computer she could afford slowed her down and she had to pause on the class until August.
- Her goal after the program is to get a job so that she can buy a home in a safe place for her daughter. She would like to work back in the office again but also needs flexibility to work from home when needed. She said taking the class has brought back great memories of her life when she had a career in healthcare. She said she gets excited about the information and finds herself closing her eyes and smiling to finally get her life back again.
