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

Between 2017 and 2021, there were 149 youth suicides in Kansas



Kansas Suicide Deaths, Age 10-17 2017-2021, N=149

Decedent History	
History of maltreatment as a victim	
Open CPS case at time of death	
Previous out of home placement	
History of mental health services	
Child was currently receiving mental health services	
History of substance use services	
Child had history of delinquent or criminal activity	
Child experienced suicidal behaviors/attempts	
Child communicated any suicidal thoughts, actions or intents	
Showed warning signs - Talked about or made plans for suicide	
Showed warning signs - Expressed hopelessness about the future	
Showed warning signs - Displayed severe/overwhelming emotional pain or distress	
Showed warning signs - Expressed perceived burden on others	
Showed warning signs - Worrisome behavioral cues or marked changes in behavior	
Showed warning signs - None listed	
Showed warning signs - Unknown	
Child experienced known crisis	



Youth Suicides age 10-17, Kansas 2017-2021, N=149



Of the Kansas youth who died by suicide, 44% had previously received mental health services, and 31% were receiving them at the time of their death.



38% were known to have experienced a crisis within 30 days of suicide.


