The Chairman recognized Department of Revenue Official, Carmen Alldritt, Director of Vehicles, who updated the Committee on SB 9 An Act providing for improved security for drivers' licenses and identification cards. This law has given the Department of Revenue the authority to initiate fundamental changes to the State of Kansas Drivers Licensing and Identification Issuance Processes.(Attachment 1) The Division has the ability to exchange identity information with other state agencies and has the authority to create law enforcement positions for the purpose of fraud prevention. Kansas is one of ten states that are materially compliant with the Real ID Program.

Cost saving measures have been taken where ever possible and a Kansas Drivers License is still \$26.00. <u>HB 2482 - Expiration and renewal of drivers' licenses, requirements</u> will aid in additional cost savings and better service if passed.

Mr Mitchell, Mr. Reynoldson and Mr. Smith answered questions of the Committee regarding the type of training given driver license examiners to be able to detect fraud and the types of criminal activity that are occurring in Kansas.

The next meeting is February 2. This will be a Hearing on **HB 2445 - Land uses adjacent to military** installations.
